Dear All,

Greetings in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ!

We are now in the midst of Advent! Hallelujah! What a glorious season it is for the Church! We have the joy of *actively* waiting with expectant hope for the coming of Christ! Liturgically we commemorate and celebrate the coming Incarnation, the birth of Jesus of Nazareth to Mary in Bethlehem. In the here and now, we anticipate his return in clouds descending, coming to bring the new Heaven and the new Earth. It is only fitting that for such a significant season we have some of the best hymns of the entire year. On the first Sunday of Advent we closed worship by singing *Lift Up Your Heads, Ye Mighty Gates*. The second and third verse keep playing in my head. Here is the second:

Fling wide the portals of your heart; make it a temple, set apart from earthly use for heaven's employ, adorned with prayer and love and joy.

I absolutely love this idea that our hearts are made into sacred spaces when we open up the doors and let God in. For, that is exactly our task during the season of Advent—to open up our hearts and thus to prepare the way for the Incarnation, Immanuel, the indwelling of God! I invite you to do this vital Adventen work within the beloved community of the First Presbyterian Church of Highland. Throughout this season we have wonderful opportunities to connect with each other and with God in this heart work! Within the context of our weekly Sunday worship services, we have the opportunity to focus on the themes of hope, peace, joy, and love—bringing them to life in Word and Song and Action. Leading up to Christmas we will be widening the Wisdom of our hearts through our Adult Connections and ADVENTure experiences. Throughout the season we will have the possibility of opening up our hearts to those lifted up in Jesus' *Matthew* 25 call by ringing the Salvation Army bell, buying gifts and food for families in need, cooking for our food ministries, and baking cookies and singing Christmas carols for those who could use some extra joy.

Speaking of singing, please note that our Christmas Cantata will be during worship on Sunday, December 18! Our choir has been hard at work preparing a beautiful, meaningful musical experience to help lead us all in opening our hearts for the arrival of Christ. Please be sure to invite your loved ones to connect with us on that day! Please also note the rest of our Advent and Christmas worship schedule. Our Christmas Eve service will be at 7:00 PM on Saturday, December 24. This will be in person and livestreamed. Then, <u>our Christmas Day</u> <u>service will be online only</u> on Sunday, December 25, at 10:30 AM. This will allow all of us to connect in worship while also being present with our loved ones Christmas morning.

My heart is wide open and overflowing with joy as I anticipate joining with all of you as we prepare the way of the Lord!

And now the third verse:

Redeemer, come, with us abide; our hearts to thee we open wide; let us thy inner presence feel; thy grace and love in us reveal.




This month the *Matthew* 25 spotlight is shining upon our Bring Your Own Bible crew! They have also read through the dense text of *Galatians* through the lens of the PC(USA)'s *Matthew* 25 initiative, which focuses on dismantling structural racism, eradicating systemic poverty, and building congregational vitality. As is the case with all Bible study, by exploring the Word with our minds, we are bringing it into our hearts and inspiring action. Well done, Bring Your Own Bible crew! All are welcome to join us on Zoom on any given Wednesday evening at 7:00 PM. Each week there is a fresh passage and fresh topic, so it is always a good time to start!

If you witness the Matthew 25 call being embodied by any person or group of people, please let Pastor Tyler know so that they can be lifted up in this section!



- Jeffery Savage, President of the Trustees, reported that the concrete project by Door B has been completed, and the awnings above Doors B and I have been ordered.
- The Butter Braid and craft sale fundraisers have been very successful. Thanks to all who supported these projects! Soup sales will return on the 2nd Sunday of January.
- A meeting was held on November 15th to discuss the upcoming sanctuary screen project. Those attending included: Vicky Brann (IT consultant), Jesse, Robbie and Tristan Casiano, Tracy Oprea, Bonnie Perryman, Jean Smith and Rev. Tyler. We discussed placement of the screens, software and equipment needed, and training/operation of the text and images that will be displayed. The screens will not entirely replace the bulletins but offer a different way to experience worship. Some bulletins will still be available once the screens are operational. If you have questions about this project, please talk to a Session member.
- There will be a called congregational meeting on December 11th after worship for the purpose of electing officers to begin serving in 2023. We will also be considering a motion from Session to make a term-limit exception to our bylaws in order to ensure that our Trustee spots are filled.
- A memorial for Jane Vance will be held at the church on December 10^{th} .
- The Presbytery Assembly meeting will be on December 8th at 2 pm. At this meeting, Pastor Tyler will be installed as the new moderator of Presbytery for 2023. Congratulations, Rev. Tyler!

Youth Connections members have been busy this fall! At our bi-weekly gatherings, we've talked about our thoughts and emotions through the discussion of a psalm, decorated paper bags for the food pantry, started exploring connections between science and faith through some hands-on "experiments," successfully made our way through a corn maze, picked apples at an apple orchard, and helped decorate the sanctuary for Advent and Christmas during the annual Hanging of the Greens. Whew that's a lot – but our youth and young adults are awesome!

The annual <u>Christmas Cookie Baking and Caroling is scheduled for December 11th</u> after worship. We'll have lunch together, bake and decorate Christmas cookies in the church kitchen, and then go caroling to some church members homes. Bring a friend or two and plan now to join us for this fun tradition!

EVERYONE in the congregation is invited to join the Youth Connections group for Christmas caroling on Dec. 11th. If you'd like to spread some holiday cheer, meet us at the church at 3 pm. - <u>"The Bible in Today's World"</u> class takes place on Sunday mornings at 9 am, in the upstairs meeting room. They are using the "Animate: Faith" curriculum, combining short videos and lively group conversation. <u>This class will resume in January</u>. - Wednesday evening <u>"BYOB" (Bring Your Own Bible)</u> discussion takes place each Wednesday evening, 7-8 pm, online on Zoom. We look deeper into Scripture from current topics in the church and from Sunday services. The link to log in to Zoom is emailed out weekly. <u>There will be no BYOB on Dec. 21 or 28, and will resume on Jan. 4.</u> Contact Heather Casiano with any questions.

If you have an idea for a new small group or class, please let us know. We would love to help get a new group formed as there is interest. Groups can meet any day of the week, at the church or elsewhere. Share your ideas and we'll help make them happen!



The season of Advent is upon us. The Faith Development team invites everyone to join us in the Fellowship Room after worship each Sunday of Advent for another series of "ADVENTures"! This year's ADVENTure will include a short video each week and an interactive art project for all ages, that will be displayed during the Christmas season in the church – different from last year's paper chain project. Our project is appropriate for all ages and all skill levels, so come join us. Stay as long or as short a time as you are able and bring your friends and family!



VISUAL PRAYER

The prayer wall, inside Door D by the church office, is looking beautiful! So many colorful ribbons representing prayers and praises for so many people and situations around the world – Praise be to our God that we can so freely bring all our concerns, worries and excitements to them in prayer!!

If you aren't familiar with the prayer wall, there is a guide posted on the wall next to the prayer ribbons. You can choose one or more colorful ribbons to represent the types of prayers you wish to uplift. You can speak your prayer(s) out loud or to yourself as you tie the ribbon(s) on the wire or weave them in. There is nothing to write down, and all prayers remain anonymous except to our God, who knows our needs even before we do!

Everyone is invited to say a prayer for all the ribbons already added and the needs they represent, regardless of whether you add your own ribbons or not. Over time, the ribbons will fill in the wire and become a beautiful piece of art representing our prayers.






In place of providing a paper devotional booklet this year for Advent, the Faith Development team is offering a variety of devotions to choose from. Pick one or try out several – whatever makes your Advent experience meaningful.

- Use the "Read the Bible in a Year" reading plan as your daily Advent devotional. As you read the suggested passages each day, think about how it fits into the larger story of God's redeeming work through Jesus.
- There are 24 chapters in the gospel according to Luke. Start on Dec. 1st and read one chapter a day to get you through Christmas Eve. The author of Luke's gospel gives us a pretty thorough view of Jesus' life and ministry from birth to death-resurrection-ascension.
- Read a different Psalm each day of Advent leading up to Christmas. Reflect on the emotions the writer expresses, the questions asked, and the hope the writer finds. In what ways can you identify with the psalmist? What questions do you have for God in this season of waiting? Where do you find hope?
- Pittsburgh Theological Seminary offers a free Advent devotional each year, which can be found online at https://www.pts.edu/devotional_1 . You can download the entire devotional at once, or visit the webpage each day to read and/or listen to that day's entry.
- Kate Bowler, a Christian author, speaker, and professor at Duke Divinity School, shares her free 4-week Advent devotional here: <u>https://katebowler.com/advent2022/</u> Enter your name and email address on the page, and the devotional will be emailed to you.
- Luther Seminary has a free Advent devotional on their website to download in regular or large print: <u>https://www.luthersem.edu/godpause/advent-devotional/</u>
- Visit the website <u>https://d365.org/</u> or download the d365 app on your mobile device for free devotionals every day of the year, and specially themed devotions during Advent. Each short daily devotion features a "Pause-Listen-Think-Pray-Go" format, with optional music in background.

READ THE BIBLE IN A YEAR

We're almost there! There are 31 days in December, giving us 31 more days to either complete our year of reading the Bible, or to start a new reading challenge for yourself. It's never too late to start reading God's Word. In the coming year 2023, we will highlight resources each month that can help you in better understanding or studying the scripture that you've read.

The December Bible reading plan is included in this newsletter, and it will be posted on our church's website (<u>www.fpchighland.org</u>). If you would like to discuss anything you read in the Bible or have questions, please reach out to Pastor Tyler or Heather – we'd love to chat with you. May this year in the Bible be a blessing to you!




