Greetings in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ!


I leave you with these words from *Matthew*:

TRUSTEES

- Furnace installation is complete in Fellowship Hall. K & M will work, as weather and their schedule permits, on the removal of old AC units that aren't operational, and will install new units for the sanctuary in the spring.
- The irrigation system was winterized.
- All necessary permits and licenses have been obtained.
- Boilers have been checked.
- The shed was removed from the south lot.
- Bob Abernathy was thanked for his work as a Trustee this year as he is going off the board.

DEACONS

- Sunshine Bags: One was created and given in November and two are planned for December.
- Prayer Shawl Ministry: Two shawls were blessed on November 26 th.
- Blessing Box: Deacons continue to check and stock the box daily. Funds and donations remain low; however, many items have been generously placed directly into the box. Thank you to those persons and to the individual deacons who have contributed without reimbursement.
- Gladys' Table: Gladys' meals of lasagna, bean salad, garlic bread and cookie bars were prepared and delivered on November 18th. The meal was prepared by Munster High School students and Krissy LaFlech and delivered by deacons. The next meal was December 16th.
- Sackurday: November 25th Sackurday of 44 lunches was prepared and distributed by Lois Fozkos, Pam Porter and Jean Smith.
- Pastor Tyler thanked the Deacons for their perseverance during a difficult year with many changes. The Deacons thanked him for being the moderator these last months.

SESSION

- Fundraisers: The craft sale was a big success and made \$1158.78. We thanked Lee Ann Cheesebrough for all her organizational work as well as her crafts and all those who contributed to the crafts.
- Soup sales are back: We will be having soup sales on 3rd Sundays beginning January 21st.
- The budget for 2024 was approved. The congregation will receive the budget at the annual congregational meeting on January 14th.
- The elders set the installation of officers for January 14th during worship.



- Session will be hosting a meal at the congregational meeting on January 14th. There will be a sign-up sheet in the narthex the next few weeks, and the congregation members will be asked to bring either a salad, side or dessert.
- Session approved Heather Casiano's contract as Faith Development Coordinator for 2024. The elders and Pastor expressed gratitude for all Heather has done and contributed to our faith development program.
- We worked on a fellowship host schedule for January and February where the members of the ministries of our church would rotate the host/hostess duties.
- Session will be changing our meeting date in 2024 to the 3rd Tuesday of each month, with in-person meetings, and also hybrid. Our first meeting for the year will be on Tuesday, January 16th at 6:30 pm.
- Pastor Tyler thanked all the elders for their service this year. He thanked Elder Bonnie Perryman as she is leaving the Session after serving 6 years. Her service and contributions were acknowledged by all the elders.
- The elders then thanked Pastor Tyler for his ministry, encouragement and faith leadership.


