Dear All,

For this letter, I would like to highlight a magnificent way in which we at First Presbyterian Church of Highland have recently served as a source of healing in the world. The Ministry of Mission recently decided to donate \$500 to our partner church, Chimwemwe Presbyterian Church in Kitwe, Zambia. We have made similar donations in the past for various building and service projects, and you can see the fruits of those donations on the bulletin board in Fellowship Hall. This time around, the gift was particularly significant in its possible impact.

The Mission of First Presbyterian Church of Highland is to be the HEART, HANDS, and FEET of Jesus Christ The countries of Central and Southern Africa, including Zambia, have been suffering from a long term drought. According to the United Nations Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs, "Zambia is experiencing the driest agricultural season in more than forty years, resulting in significant crop losses, increased livestock deaths, and worsening poverty. Over nine million people in 84 out of the 117 districts are affected." Anecdotally, I have heard from many friends in Zambia that the drought, coupled with global inflation, has caused unimaginable difficulty for people simply trying to survive. So, our partners decided to use our donation to make a borehole for water for the church and surrounding community. Here are some photos of the work being done:



What a wonderful way to participate in the work of God's radical love in partnership with our siblings in the Body of Christ by sharing the water of life! My Bemba has never been great, but there is a saying something along the lines of *amenshi ubumi*, meaning, "Water is life!" Thank you, FPCH family, for being the heart, hands, and feet of Jesus!

- An estimate on tree trimming that is needed is being explored.
- A calendar needs to be instituted to note dates for renewal of all inspections and permits.
- Other routine maintenance was discussed.
- There will be no July meeting.

Stewardship: Not Just Giving, It's A Way of Living!

Years ago, Ilene's preacher noticed the family standing in front of him at a New Orleans convenience store did not have enough money to pay for their few items. He tapped the man on the shoulder and said, "You don't need to turn around, but please accept this money." The man took the money without ever seeing the preacher.

Nine years later, the pastor was invited to speak at a church in New Orleans. After the service, a man walked up to the preacher and shared this story about how he had come to faith in Christ: "Several years ago, my wife and our child and I were destitute. We had lost everything, had no jobs, no money and were living in our car. We also lost all hope and agreed to a suicide pact. However, we decided to first give our son some food, so we drove to a convenience store to buy him some food and milk. While we were standing in line at the store, we realized that we did not have enough money to pay for these items, but a man behind us asked us to please take the money from his hand and not look at him. This man told us, 'Jesus loves you.' We left the store intending to follow through on our plan and wept for hours. We couldn't go through with it, so we drove away. As we drove, we noticed a church with a sign out front which said, 'Jesus loves you.'"

He then told the pastor, "When you began speaking this morning, I knew immediately that you were the man who gave us that money." How did he know? The pastor was from South Africa and had a very distinct accent. He continued, "Your act of kindness was much more than a simple good deed. Three people are alive today because of it."

May we remember that God can work through our gifts in ways that we can never even imagine!

"So then, as we have opportunity, let us do good to everyone."—Galatians 6:10
