We invite everybody to join us as we seek to put our words to work by embarking upon the journey of antiracism work in our congregation. Thank you for getting us started on the necessary work of responding to our *Matthew* 25 call to dismantle structural racism!

As a reminder, this section of the Larger View is here to highlight our embodiment of the *Matthew* 25 initiative to which we have committed. This initiative is focused on the following:

- Building congregational vitality by challenging people and congregations to deepen their faith and get actively and joyfully engaged with their community and the world.
- **Dismantling structural racism** by advocating and acting to break down the systems, practices and thinking that underlie discrimination, bias, prejudice and oppression of people of color.
- **Eradicating systemic poverty** by working to change laws, policies, plans and structures in our society that perpetuate economic exploitation of people who are poor.

Bill and I came from different faith journeys; we chose to start our marriage and restart our faith journey by joining St Paul's Lutheran church in Oct. 1971. Her memory of the flood was that she "got to help us with our laundry and dishes and grateful she could be a part of our lives." Wow! I got a glimpse of a whole new attitude. That's what I feel lives on these grounds and in this building, a "get to" attitude. We get to be the Heart, Hands, and Feet of Jesus. We get to feed His lambs and tend His sheep. We get to follow Jesus. I am grateful for the FPCH experiences I get to live in and show love. At FPCH I get to live, worship and praise the infinitude of God.

With attitude, gratitude and God's infinitude may I continue to get to grow here,

Tristan Casiano




