

Dear All,

Greetings in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ!

In our liturgical calendar, we are making our way towards Jerusalem with Jesus. Our scripture readings have been taking us through the life and ministry of the messiah and his disciples. We have engaged these readings by taking an honest look at what it means for us to become disciples ourselves and then to authentically live as disciples. We have seen Simon Peter, James, and John being called on the Sea of Galilee. We have experienced the crowds growing ever larger, pressing in all around Jesus. We have witnessed healings, exorcisms, and revolutionary sermons on the truth of a different Kingdom. We have heard the outrage, heckling, and threatening of the Sadducees, the Pharisees, the scribes, and the teachers of the law. All of this is moving us towards the cataclysmic drama of Christ's passion, when the religious elites and the Roman Empire join hands in an attempt to bring death to this alternative Kingdom and its king.

This month begins our observance of Lent, the Church's major time of reflection, repentance, and renewal. This should be a time for us to really wrestle with the meaning of discipleship. What does discipleship truly look like? What do we need to do differently? What are the risks? How can we better develop ourselves and our congregation in our faith and mission? How can we better obey the great commission of the disciples to share the good news with the world? These are all questions that we must explore and use to guide our journey as First Presbyterian Church of Highland. Such an exploration can lead us to do our part in ensuring the continued life of that Kingdom with its now risen king.

There are several upcoming opportunities to address these questions in our life together. We have the opportunity to support our youth as they respond to the great commission by attending their Saturday Nyte Live event on March 2. We have an Ash Wednesday worship service on March 6. We have a Lenten study and practice class on Wednesday mornings from March 13 to April 17. And of course we have our Sunday morning classes and worship together. I encourage all of us to be intentional in our spiritual life as a community as we strive to be disciples this Lent.

- Session approved a small capital campaign for updating and replacing landscaping outside the church building.
- Elder Charlotte Abernethy reported that Faith Development is busy during this Lenten season with the Saturday Nyte Live Fundraiser on March 2<sup>nd</sup> for the youth mission trip, a Lenten series taught by Rev. Orem on Wednesdays beginning on March 13<sup>th</sup>, and an Easter Egg hunt and event planned for April 20<sup>th</sup>. A 2-day summer VBS is being considered and a confirmation class taught by Rev. Orem is being planned for youth in grades 7-8 in the fall with a possible time change of 9:00 am for kids' church school.
- The Trustees are working on several projects: the continuing of LED light replacement around the building, purchasing doormats for the entering office and fellowship hall entries, and constructing a shade structure for the parking lot fundraiser in the summer.
- The Ministry of Finance is looking for another member for its ministry. If this is an area of interest for you, please contact Elder Vince Catania.
- Elder Cheryl Steen reported that the Ministry of Mission has donated money this month to the Christmas Joy Fund, to Habitat for Humanity for a home being built in Merrillville for a disabled vet and to the Meals on Wheels "Meal Heroes program" to subsidize meals for those who cannot afford them.
- Elder Bonnie Perryman reported that the ministry is busy planning for the Easter Season with an Ash Wednesday service on March 6<sup>th</sup>, Palm Sunday and Maundy Thursday services. Fish banks will be distributed for members to participate in One Great Hour of Sharing.
- The congregation continues to be the heart, hands and feet of Jesus Christ as volunteers cook and serve at the warming shelter on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Saturday of the month and at Gladys' table on the last Saturday of the month. More help is always needed. Contact Cheryl Steen for the shelter and Sharon LaFlech for Gladys' Table.
- Please continue to support soup sale Sundays. There are several more Sundays to volunteer to make and buy soup.
- "Shop with Scrip" is an excellent way to make money for our church by shopping where you normally shop. Gift cards or e-cards can be purchased and used at most stores where you shop. See Sharon LaFlech for more details.
- Rev. Orem and Elder Lois Fozkos attended the Presbytery meeting on Saturday, February 16 in Rochester, IN
- Session brainstormed ideas for long range plans for our church. This will continue to be an item for discussion at upcoming Session meetings. If you have any ideas you would like considered, please contact a Session member.

Landscape Improvement Project
Dear members and friends of FPCH,

Last year, we completed several projects making FPCH a more inviting, welcoming and functioning facility for members and guests. We encourage everyone to read about the projects in the Annual Report. This Spring, we plan to improve the landscape at FPCH and seek your donation for the project.

We plan to install fresh, new landscape making FPCH a more attractive, safe and welcoming place of worship. After removing the old landscape, we'll plant a decorative tree and other plants along each side of the two entrance stairs, install new landscape in front of the center building and along the north fence line, we'll install river rock. The estimates range from about \$9,000-\$12,000, depending upon the final design. To help you visualize the proposed landscape, please see the attached images.

The slip you choose is the person you will pray for during Lent.

Keep that person's identity a secret during this time.

Praying for this person is what is asked of you.

Toward the end of Lent, mail an Easter card to your Secret Prayer Partner.




