

Dear All,

Greetings in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ!

We have just entered Lent, the holiest of seasons for us Christians. Liturgically, Lent is modeled on the forty days and forty nights that Jesus spent fasting in the desert wilderness at the beginning of his public ministry. Jesus used that time of deep spiritual practice to prepare himself for all that was to come for the rest of his life. In the short term that meant an encounter with the cosmic enemy, tempting Jesus to choose the ways of the powers and principalities of the world. In the long term that meant Jesus' journey through the countryside, ultimately making his way to Jerusalem. He was preparing himself for all the teaching, preaching, healing, exorcising, cooking, eating, arguing, resisting, befriending, loving, grieving, suffering, and dying.

For us, Lent is a time of deep spiritual practice during which we intentionally encounter our own desert wilderness, the space of reflection and preparation in our own lives. It is also our season of empathy—when we are to enter into Jesus' own experience of life and death. We are to feel his sorrow and pain as the full weight of the world pressed down upon him. We are to consider how we are adding to people's sorrow and pain today as the full weight of the world presses down upon them. We are to confess. We are to repent. We are to make reparations. We are to change our ways.

Some people use fasting and deprivation as their spiritual practice, just as Jesus did. Some choose to go full days without eating. Some choose to abstain from meat or sweets or alcohol or some other object of consumption. Others use the addition of healthy things to their lives as their spiritual practice—consuming more vegetables, reading more scripture, praying more, exercising more, going to church more frequently, or writing more. Whatever spiritual practice you choose, I pray that you will approach it with intentionality and gravity. I pray that you will honestly embrace it as an opportunity to transform your life and so to transform the world.

Remember, this is not a season of isolation. The beauty of the Church is that we go on these journeys together. Join us on Sundays for class and worship. Join us on Wednesdays for study and practice. Join us for prayer no matter where you may be or what day it is.

Isn't This the Fast I Choose? 2020 Lenten Study and Practice

On Wednesday mornings throughout Lent, Pastor Tyler will again be leading a series on devotional study and spiritual practice. This year we will be focusing on the spiritual practice of fasting, which many Christian traditions regard as the heart of the Lenten liturgical season. The framework of this season comes from Jesus' fast in the desert for forty days and forty nights prior to being encountered by the Satan. We will be exploring various understandings of this spiritual practice by looking through the lens of major moments of fasting in our scriptures, including readings from *Matthew*, *Esther*, *Daniel*, *Jonah*, and *Isaiah*. We will also be exploring how we ourselves can view and implement fasting as a spiritual practice. We will be gathering in the fellowship hall at 9:30 AM on Wednesdays March 4, March 11, March 18, March 25, and April 1. ALL ARE WELCOME!

the stations of the cross.



The God Who Sees: Immigrants, the Bible, and the Journey to Belong by Karen Gonzalez

In her book, Karen Gonzalez reminds us that "immigrant stories always matter, because immigrants are image-bearers of God." She uses the stories of several biblical immigrants (like Abraham, Hagar, and the Holy Family) alongside her own personal stories of being a first-generation Guatemalan immigrant to challenge and encourage us in how we approach immigration and those who have made the journey to this country. Gonzalez uses the Christian sacraments as the framework for telling her stories and the impact of faith on her story.


