
Prayer List

Dear All,

Greetings in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ!

A new month is upon us, and still we find ourselves huddled behind closed doors as pandemic plagues the world. I am reminded once more of the disciples huddled behind closed doors in the upper room following the crucifixion of their Lord. The parallels are striking and instructive. Just as Jesus appeared in their midst, Jesus is also in our midst no matter where we may be. He is speaking words of peace upon us and breathing Holy Spirit into us. He is giving us hope to hold onto when as the waves of despair wash over us and threaten to overtake us with their temptations. May we be ever vigilant for his presence, especially in these times!

On April 20, 2020, our Session voted once again to extend our suspension of in-person activities at the church building, including communal worship. Our hope and prayer is to resume in-person activities beginning with worship on Sunday, May 17. We acknowledge that we may have to delay the date again as things progress, as front-line workers and scientific researchers advise, and as policies and orders dictate. No matter what may come, though, Jesus will be present in our midst granting us peace and filling us with the Spirit of new life.

In the meantime, we will continue the meaningful practices of spiritual togetherness that we have been developing together. We will keep calling each other and speaking peace upon each other. We will keep serving curbside meals to people who are facing hunger—some for the first time and some for the hundredth time. We will keep supporting our mission partners. We will keep praying for each other. And of course we will keep worshiping! Of special note, we will be celebrating Communion on Sunday, May 3. As we will be doing so remotely, I encourage you to gather the elements together at home. Find some bread or tortillas or crackers. Make some if you can! Pour some juice or wine. Remember that Communion is the ultimate act of spiritual togetherness.

On a Sunday very soon we will be honoring Jesus as our Good Shepherd. In light of that loving image, I invite you to remember these words from *Psalm* 23: "Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me. You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies. You anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows. Surely your goodness and love will follow me all the days of my life, and I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever."

- We were apprised of the flooding that occurred in the Sunday School rooms in the lower level of the old sanctuary. Thank you to Cheryl, Debbie, Tracy, Jeff and Eason for their efforts in getting this cleaned up. We will be getting an update on how we can solve this problem, and the cost.

- We also want to thank the members of Gladys Table for providing lunches every Saturday since March 28th and the Mission team that prepares and delivers the meals to the warming shelter.
- We have postponed worship until May 17, 2020. There will be a remote Communion service for the May 3rd worship service. The Deacons will notify their clusters.
- The next Session meeting will be on May 11th, 2020, via ZOOM.

TRUSTEE HAPPENINGS APRIL 2020

Spring is almost here! As I write this article, the forecast calls for 2-4 inches of snow. Yuck! The Garden will green soon. *The Trustees*




The south sanctuary lower level flooded mid-April. Thanks to quick work from Jeff Savage, Debbie Catania, Carolyn Ham and Cheryl Steen damage was limited to a few boxes and rolls of paper.

Global Maintenance cleaned the carpets and the tile floors. The problem appeared to be caused by recent rains and snow melt.

One of the three boilers developed an oil leak and is out of service. Another boiler had an inoperable baffle motor but the problem was remedied. Toddco, the servicing contractor, is working on a recommendation about the defective boiler. We can safely operate with two functioning boilers especially since the church is closed and the weather is warming.

In coordination with Ministry of Finance, the Trustees applied for a forgivable loan from the Payroll Protection Program. The loan was approved and funds from the plan are expected to be available soon, The loan is to pay employees for two months and to pay for a portion of our utility expenses.

The 2020 Snow virus came to the FPCH during April. Spring is in action! Be safe!

April Shelter Report

Since we were unable to actually serve at the shelter, the 3 musketeers, Judy, Jamie and Cheryl decided we would shop and cook for the 40 residents of the shelter. We were not permitted in the shelter, so the meal of pork chops, scalloped potatoes, green beans, salad, milk, eggs and cake were delivered at our usual time on Saturday April 11th and left outside on a table. They were going to be serving themselves.

But that left the guests that came in from the street every Saturday without food!! It was impossible to prepare them a hot meal since they had nowhere to eat, so we made 18 carry out containers so they could just pick up a box and have a meal of ham, cheese and turkey sandwiches. We also added a hard boiled egg, a homemade cookie, cheese sticks, a bag of chips, a piece of candy and bottle of water.

Since we were encouraged to leave right away and not mingle with the folks, I have no idea how the box lunches went over but hopefully they at least enjoyed some food for the evening.

A special thank you to Jamie Ham and Judy Toren for being there and suffering with me while wearing the masks made for us by Lois Fozkos. BUT we were following the rules!!!

John Toren and Jeff Savage went with us to deliver the food. They always step up when we need extra help.







CALLING ALL GARDENERS!

Ministry of Mission will once again be selling flower vouchers to be used at Zandstra's Greenhouse. The cost will be \$15.00 per voucher.

In order to make this program work in light of Covid 19 restrictions there are new rules to follow.

- 1. Call Tracy, Cheryl or me and we will arrange a non-contact switch: you put your check or money in an envelope and leave outside your door, one of us will pick up at a prearranged time and leave the vouchers in your envelope.
- 2. Call Zandstra's at 924-1095 and make an appointment for a 45 minute shopping time. This limits the number of people inside the greenhouse and will allow everyone to maintain the 6 foot distancing while shopping. You can also schedule a shopping time on their website.
- 3. Or alternately, you can go to their website to view which plants and flowers they have and call in your order to be picked up at a designated time at curbside.
- 4. Turn in your voucher at the end of your shopping trip or pickup and our church will receive credit for your purchase.

This program has been a very useful tool to start spring off right in past years and with the stay-at-home order this year, will give everyone a chance to beautify your environment to make that stay more pleasant.

WE CONTINUE TO SERVE

On March 28th Gladys' Table community meal altered our serving practice from inside table dining to drive up service, due to state guidelines to practice safe distancing. We served curbside sack lunches that day from a table setup outside on Delaware Street. Tracy Oprea and Krissy LaFlech helped prepare oven baked ham and cheese sandwiches and then stepped up to act as car hops. Along with the foil wrapped sandwiches we packed 40 lunch bags with applesauce cups, chips and cuties. Because we only had the internet to advise those who normally attend this community meal, we only had a few of the regular diners show up. We delivered some to the Highland Police Dept. and placed 15 lunches in the Blessing Box and posted it on Facebook. Within an hour of that posting, all sack lunches had been picked up. Because this was just the beginning of an increasing need of our community, people starting volunteering to sponsor Sack Lunch Saturdays. With the sponsorship and help of Kelly LaFlech, Dana Bell (Lowell High School teacher) and her daughter Ashley we were able to continue for another 2 weeks of lunches. We then had three FPCH families and a former pastor of FPCH ask to be partners in our meal sharing. Our planning was for a week at a time, then because of word of mouth and internet postings and group sharing, we are now able to continue this much needed service thru June (this projection has been based on approx. 40-45 lunches). God always

provides a plan for feeding the hungry, we need to recognize our responsibility to deliver on that plan. We have had contributions from Barton's Pizza (Highland) and White Castle (Hammond) and now we are promised tacos form Boss Man Taco (Highland) and hot dogs from Arnies Hot Dogs (Munster) in May. Gladys' Table will continue to provide the sack lunch for the last Saturday of the month. The remaining SACKURDAY'S thru June will be covered by the hearts and hands of FPCH family members, community members and businesses. It is our prayer that this continue as the need increases week to week (we are anticipating the need of 50 lunches this last Sackurday of April). Beginning with this last week in April we will have homemade masks available for those who have indicated the need.

I also want to share the following gratitude post on Facebook from April 18th showing why we do this!
