

#### Dear All,

Greetings in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ! November begins with the celebration of All Saints' Day and closes out with Thanksgiving. What fitting bookends to mark our life together this month!

We Protestants often have a gut reaction against naming or acknowledging saints. Such has been the case since the Reformation itself, when the reformers rightfully challenged certain practices of devotion to the saints. As a Presbyterian pastor, however, I find myself grieving because of our inattention to the saints. I find myself longing for our tradition to reclaim rituals of recognizing and honoring those who have joined the resurrection.

Our scriptures often make reference to "saints," using the term to describe any fellow believer. Over the past several months we have been making our way through the book of *Acts*, paying close attention to Paul's journeys and the communities to which he would later write his epistles. Paul's epistles abound with the language of the saints. For example, he writes in *I Corinthians* to the church of Priscilla and Aquila: "To the church of God that is in Corinth, to those who are sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be saints, together with all those who in every place call on the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, both their Lord and ours: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ." In this sense, every single one of us is a saint! For All Saints' Day we specifically pay attention to the saints who have come and gone before us, those who are now seated at the banquet table in the presence of God. We honor the things they taught us and the joy they brought us. We remember how they impacted us and the Kingdom. We recognize that they are still with us as the Church triumphant, worshipping the same God and perhaps even singing the same hymns of praise.

This season is especially poignant for me, as it was exactly two years ago that I presided over the funeral of Saint Teresa Marshall, also known as Aunt T. Saint Teresa, my mom's older sister, was a second mother to all of us nieces and nephews. She loved us fiercely to the end and consistently expressed that love by showing up in our times of need and celebration as well as in the mundane activities of our daily lives. I will never forget my life with her. I will never forget standing by her bedside as she breathed that special final breath of the Holy Spirit. I will never forget eulogizing her and speaking the words of commendation on All Saints' Day 2017. Saint Teresa showed me the love of God through her unconditional love for my family. I am sure that every single person in this congregation has people in their lives like Aunt T, saints who have taught us how to love and thus who have taught us how to know God. I pray that we will all take time this season to reflect on them, to imagine the glory they are now in, and to honor them in the ways that we go about our lives.

I close in thanksgiving, our other bookend, with these words from Paul's epistle to the church in Philippi, the church of Lydia: "I thank my God every time I remember you, constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you, because of your sharing in the gospel from the first day until now. I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work among you will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ. It is right for me to think this way about all of you, because you hold me in your heart, for all of you share in God's grace with me, both in my imprisonment and in the defense and confirmation of the gospel. For God is my witness, how I long for all of you with the compassion of Christ Jesus. And this is my prayer, that your love may overflow more and more with knowledge and full insight to help you to determine what is best, so that in the day of Christ you may be pure and blameless, having produced the harvest of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ for the glory and praise of God."

#### As presented on October 13<sup>th</sup> worship service

With the third quarter now behind us, it is time for me to communicate to you our church's financial results thus far for 2019. You may remember the old cop show, "Dragnet" where Sargent Joe Friday, aptly played by Jack Webb, often stated - "Just the facts, ma'am." Well, ma'am- here are the facts.

As a reminder, after compiling our 2018 stewardship campaign consisting of your pledges which is the majority of our church's income and determining our plans for spending which included our commitment to Tyler, our new minister, we viewed 2019 as a deficit budget year. Through the 1<sup>st</sup> 9 months of the year our church remains about 30% better than our planned deficit. I reported a similar improvement a quarter ago.

As I had reported last quarter our ministries have continued to spend less than their planned spending but since the last quarter report to you there has been a falloff in our member's generosity with 40% of our pledgers not supporting our church at the level or pace of giving that they individually committed to.

"Just the facts, maam."

May God be in your hearts as you reflect on your individual commitments to our church, not only for the remainder of this year but also as we commence our stewardship and budget planning for 2020 which is currently gearing up.

#### **October Shelter Report**

On October 12th, Highland Kiwanis prepared the meal and served at the Rescue Mission. Kiwanis is a "global organization dedicated to changing the world, one child and one community at a time. Our organization currently has about 20 members ranging in ages from mid 20's to mid 80's. Our focus is primarily on our supported-youth clubs which include five K-Kids Clubs in the four public elementary schools, Builders Club at Highland Middle School, and Key Club at Highland High School. We supply the elementary clubs with their meeting materials and we support our high school Key Club members with funds for attendance at their leadership conferences. Twice a year we read books to the kindergarten classes in all six elementary schools (including Our Lady of Grace and Highland Christian School) and then give every student a book of their own to take home. At one of our weekly meetings in May, we invite our sponsored-youth Advisors (all of whom are teachers in their respective schools) for lunch at Langel's and give them the opportunity to speak about the accomplishments of their clubs. We deliver Meals on Wheels three times/week, and we prepare and deliver dinner to Haven House on the 4th Saturday of every month. During October's Fire Prevention Month, we prepared and delivered dinner to the first responders at the fire station. Other service projects include: donating to the Little Food Pantry on Kennedy Avenue, making fleece blankets for parents of patients at Riley Hospital in Indianapolis, collecting S&VT receipts for the Builders Club, and collecting and delivering "wish list" items to Haven House. Fund-raising projects include peanut sales and fruit sales. Some of the proceeds are used for our \$1,000 scholarship to a graduating senior who is a member of Key Club. We have guest speakers from local not-for-profit organizations and/or local community members who keep us up-to-date on what is happening in our town. Highland Kiwanis meets every Thursday from 12:00-1:00 at Langel's. Visitors and new members are always welcome. For more information, contact Carol Callaway at 924-4251.


