Greetings in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ!

This coming Sunday, September 24, is the Seventeenth Sunday after Pentecost, or as we have been celebrating a full season, the Eighteenth Sunday *of* Pentecost. We will be moving from the mountain to the river, from the burning bush to the burning column, from preparation to action. We will learn of the actions of the Exodus, the liberation of the Israelites from slavery in Egypt. We will dance and sing along with Miriam, the sister of Moses and the prophetess of the Exodus. In preparation for Sunday, I invite you to dance and sing! Add some tambourine if you have it!
