TRUSTEES


Trustee President Jeffery Savage reported on the following:

- The boilers have been inspected and are being updated with safety measures.

- Deacons continue to check and stock the Blessing Box daily for perishable and outdated items. A sign has been attached to the Blessing box explaining items that can be donated.

- Kelly LaFlech prepared and handed out April 26th Gladys' Table meal.
- Pastor Tyler Orem and Pam Porter will continue to disburse funds to parishioners in need from the Smock Grant.
- The directory information was reviewed.
- The Deacon's current budgeted categories were discussed. It was decided that Prayer Shawl Ministry, Blessing Box, Glady's Table and Sackurdays will be grouped together under the new name "Sharon's Angel Fund".

Stewardship: Taking Care of Each Other, Taking Care of Our Church, Taking Care of the World

"Not Just Giving, A Way of Living"

I recently came across a yellowed *Tribune* op-ed clipping while sorting old files. I no longer question the why's of these happenstance discoveries but look for today's message in them. The article recounted a discussion with a retired army chaplain talking about military codes of conduct. "The Army gives its values as: loyalty, duty, respect, selfless service, honor, integrity and personal courage. The Marines are empowered to exemplify the ultimate in ethical and moral behavior: to never lie, cheat or steal; to abide by an uncompromising code of integrity; to respect human dignity; and to have respect and concern for each other." At FPCH we strive to make stewardship a matter of both "giving" and "living." How we live our lives is truly another way to give.....through caring, being helpful, being a positive influence, being inclusive, providing physical, moral and spiritual support and the list goes on and on. Although the military codes are very secular in origin, they sound remarkably like the very non-secular direction given to us many years ago (and every Sunday). In our troubled world, living up to those values is a contribution. It matters, and it does make a difference!



BIBLE STUDY AND DISCUSSION OPPORTUNITIES

There are two opportunities to join a Bible study or sermon/Scripture discussion group. These opportunities are open to all who are interested, from middle school students to the most mature of adults. You don't have to be a church member to participate, so invite your friends and family to join in the discussions with you.

- "<u>The Bible in Today's World</u>" Bible study group meets on <u>Sunday mornings from 9 to 10 am at the church</u>. We're continuing our reading of the book "A is for Alabaster" by Anna Carter Florence. The book takes us through the alphabet of both the Old and New Testaments, focusing on one Scripture story per letter. Each week's lesson is independent from the other weeks, so feel free to jump in any time. Contact John Toren or Heather Casiano with any questions or to get a book. <u>Our last class for this spring season will be May 18th</u>.
- "<u>BYOB</u>" (Bring Your Own Bible) discussion group meets on <u>Wednesday evenings from 7-8 pm</u> online using Zoom. Each week this group takes a look at the Scriptures and sermon from the previous Sunday's worship service, asking questions, bringing up different perspectives, and encountering the Holy Spirit in a fresh way. The link for the Zoom meetings is emailed out weekly. You can connect to Zoom with a smart phone, tablet or computer. If you're not familiar with how to use Zoom, please contact Pastor Tyler or Heather Casiano for assistance. <u>The last BYOB session will be on May 21</u>, and then will take a break until the fall.

If you have an idea for a group or class that isn't currently offered, please let us know. We would love to help get a new group formed as there is interest. Groups can meet any day of the week, at the church or elsewhere. Share your ideas and we'll help make them happen!

Iced Lemon Cake Mix Cookies Recipe From Carol Callaway

Mix together lemon cake mix (I use Duncan Hines), 1/3 c. oil, 2 large eggs, 1 T. lemon juice

Drop dough by tablespoonfuls on ungreased cookie sheet (I use a cookie scoop and parchment paper)

Bake 12-14 minutes at 350 degrees; remove from oven and let sit for 3 minutes before transferring to cooling rack.

Glaze: mix 1 c. powdered sugar and 2-3 T. lemon juice until you get desired consistency for drizzling on cooled cookies.

Recipe makes 36-40 cookies.
