If you are having a particularly hard time right now or simply need to talk, please feel free to reach out to me. We can climb the mountain together!

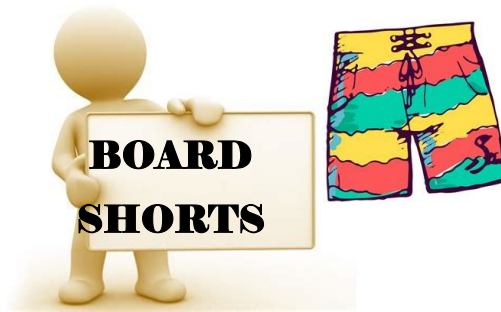
I leave you with these words from *Psalms* 121:

### **SESSION**

- Rev. Tyler welcomed the new elders Jesse Casiano and Jeffery Savage to the Session and thanked them for answering the call to service.
- Elder Jean Smith was appointed as Clerk of Session for 2026.
- Pam Porter was appointed as Treasurer for 2026.
- Jesse Casiano was elected as a commissioner to the Presbytery Assembly meeting which will take place on February 24<sup>th</sup>.
- The communion schedule for the year was approved.
- The budget for 2026 was approved. It will be distributed to the congregation for informational purposes at the annual Congregational meeting.
- The Elders selected ministries and committees for which they will act as liaisons to Session.
- Fundraisers were discussed. Soup sales will continue on February 15 and March 15 and a rummage sale is being planned for May. Other possible fundraisers are being considered.
- The Session application for Vima Couvertier-Cruz to come under care of Session as she pursues ordination has been submitted to the Presbytery.
- The Endowment Fund report was reviewed and funds that are available for this year's distribution were discussed.
- Plans were made for the luncheon following the Annual Congregational meeting.

### **TRUSTEES**

- Rodney Fozkos was elected as President of the Board of Trustees for 2026.
- Carolyn Ham was elected as secretary/treasurer.
- Insurance policies were reviewed and building permits were approved.
- Ongoing projects include investigating a missing shingle on northside sanctuary roof and an air conditioning unit that needs to be inspected along with closing off attic fan and louvers on each side of sanctuary.
- The kitchen sinks were backed up so plumbing companies were called in to unclog the drains.
- Projects suggested for this year include the following: sand and refinish front door and try to alleviate sticking; paint all wood trim around windows and doors; fix or replace breaker box so dishwasher will work; straighten or replace blades on kitchen vent fan; possibly purchase security cameras.

### **DEACONS**

- Joys and concerns of the congregation were shared.
- Sunshine Bags were given to several in our congregation.
- Prayer Shawl committee continues to work diligently to make beautiful, comforting shawls for those in need. Seventeen shawls were gifted in 2025.
- Deacons continue to check the Blessing Box daily.
- Gladys's Table: Krissy LaFlech and her Munster High school students prepared the meal on Jan 17, which the Deacons delivered.
- Sackurdays: Kelly LaFlech prepared 40 bagged meals on December 27<sup>th</sup>, and Kelly will again be preparing January 31st meals for disbursement.
- Through application, additional funds through the Smock Foundation were received. The funds will be dispersed at Pastor Tyler Orem's and Pam Porter's discretion.

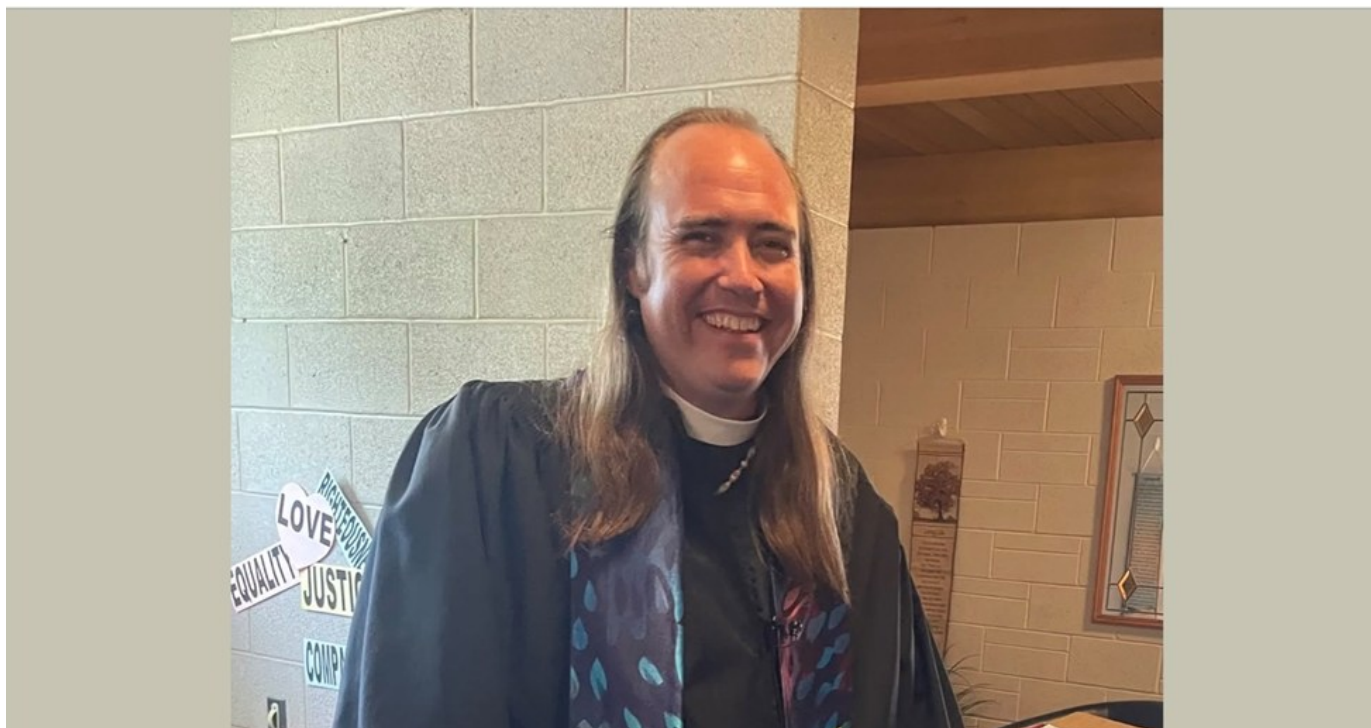

Helps prepare people for service as ministers of the word & sacrament

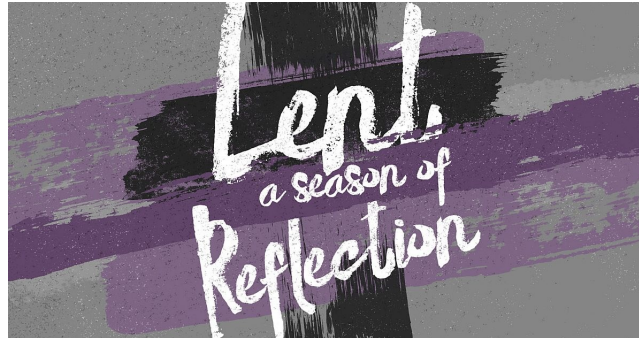

- **LENTEN STUDY AND PRACTICE WITH PASTOR TYLER**

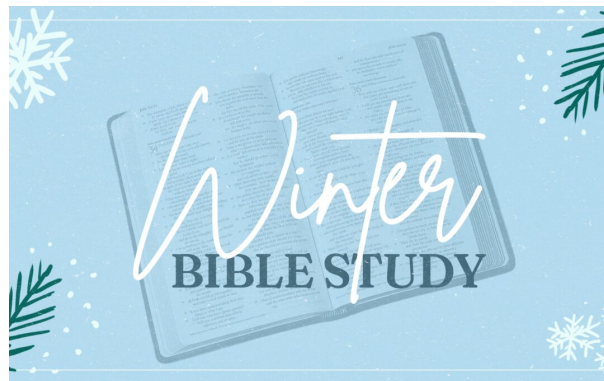
Once again, Pastor Tyler will be leading us in a special Lenten Study and Practice during the season of Lent. Join in **each Wednesday of Lent, Feb. 25 - April 1, from 7-8 pm online on Zoom**. Watch the weekly worship bulletins for the unveiling of this year's theme as it gets closer to Lent. All are welcome! The sessions will be recorded for those who would like to participate but cannot make the live sessions on Wednesdays. The Zoom link is sent out via email weekly; if you are not currently receiving this email and would like to, please contact Kristen in the church office.

- **PRAYER ACTIVITY STATIONS**

Beginning on Sunday, Feb. 22, there will be Lenten Prayer Stations set up around the church for everyone to use. In the church library room (across from the church office) there will be an indoor walkable labyrinth, as well as a few other prayer stations. There will be a couple of prayer stations in other locations in the church as well – stay tuned as we announce the locations and activities as Lent begins. The prayer stations are appropriate for all ages, so you are encouraged to share this space with the children, youth and adults in your life. The prayer stations will be available on Sundays before and after worship, and during regular church office hours (Mon. –Thurs., 8 am to noon). - **LENT DEVOTIONAL BOOKLET**

The Ministry of Faith Development will once again be providing a Lenten devotional booklet. These devotional booklets provide daily scripture, prayers and reflections to guide you through Lent. This Lenten devotional will be available in time for Ash Wednesday. They will be emailed to those on our email list, and mailed to those who don't have email. ### **WINTER BIBLE STUDY AND DISCUSSION OPPORTUNITIES**

There are currently two options to join a Bible study or sermon/Scripture discussion group. These opportunities are open to all who are interested, from middle school students to the most mature of adults. You don't have to be a church member to participate, so invite your friends and family to join in the discussions with you.

- “The Bible in Today’s World” Bible study group meets on Sunday mornings in the middle classroom (across from Pastor Tyler’s office), from 9-10 am. This group is reading through the book, “A is for Alabaster” by Anna Carter Florence. Each week is independent of the other weeks, so come as you are able. If you need a book or have any questions, contact Heather Casiano.
- “BYOB” (Bring Your Own Bible) discussion group meets on Wednesday evenings from 7-8 pm online using Zoom. Each week this group takes a look at the scriptures for the Sunday worship services, asking questions, bringing up different perspectives, and encountering the Holy Spirit in a fresh way. As we're all aware, the price of just about everything continues to rise. In an effort to keep the congregation informed, it was decided by the Board of Trustees to publish the amounts of our NIPSCO, water and phone bills in the Larger View monthly. In explanation of the bills, keep in mind that the NIPSCO bill includes gas and electric; the water bill includes two meters for the old sanctuary and the rest of the building; and the phone bill also includes internet service. Hopefully, this explains in part why our budget numbers are what they are. Below are the amounts for January.
