Greetings in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ!

ADVENT DEVOTIONAL BOOKLET

This year's advent devotional booklet, from the ministry collective "A Sanctified Art," is titled *Words for the Beginning*. This printed booklet contains poetry, scripture, reflections, songs, prayers, and full color artwork for each week of Advent, Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, and Epiphany. The entire devotional is arranged around the themes of:

- You Are A Blessing
- We Can't Go Alone
- Do The Good That Is Yours To Do
- Hope Is Worth The Risk
- Love Knows Your Name
- Don't Forget To Laugh
- The Road Isn't Straight



We have printed one copy for each household, and you can pick up your copy in the narthex of the church when you come for worship starting on Dec. 1 (the first Sunday of Advent). CREATING A SCENE FOR ADVENT

This Advent, during the "Embodied Word for Disciples" time of our worship services, we are going to make a scene – a nativity scene that is! Each week, we will hear from one of the characters who was part of that first Christmas, and then add a figurine for that character to our stable. Week by week through Epiphany a new character will be added to complete our scene. We'll be reading excerpts from the book, "Season's Greetings: Christmas Letters From Those Who Were There" by Ruth L. Boling.

If you aren't able to attend worship online or in person, we have stable backgrounds and stickers with the nativity characters for you to build your own scene at home. ONLINE ADVENT DEVOTIONS

If you enjoy a daily devotional to help you walk through the days of Advent, look no further! Advent begins on Dec. 1st this year and continues through Dec. 24th. The Faith Development team has compiled a list of several free online Advent devotionals. You can bookmark the one(s) you like on your device and read from it daily, or print a copy out. Choose whichever options make your Advent experience meaningful.

- There are 24 chapters in the gospel according to Luke. Start on Dec. 1st and read one chapter a day to get you through Christmas Eve. The author of Luke's gospel gives us a pretty thorough view of Jesus' life and ministry from birth to death-resurrection-ascension.
- D365 offers a short daily advent devotional through their "Following the Star" series, Dec. 1-24. You can follow along on their app or website, d365.org.
- <u>Pittsburgh Theological Seminary</u> offers a free Advent devotional each year, which can be found online at https://www.pts.edu/devotional_1. You can download a PDF of the devotion, or visit the webpage each day. There are also audio recordings for each day's Scripture reading and devotion that you can listen to.
- UKirk Collegiate Ministries, part of the PCUSA Office of Christian Formation, offers "Words for Waiting", their free online Advent devotional beginning Dec. 1 here: https://ukirkadvent.org/
- <u>"Boundless: An Anti-Colonial Advent Devotional"</u> is offered by the Unbound website here: https://justiceunbound.org/boundlessadvent/ Unbound is a ministry of the PCUSA, exploring the intersections of faith and justice.

The devotional will be emailed to you.


