#### CREATIVE CLASSROOM GRANTS

This year was an outstanding year for grant applicants. All the grants recommended by the evaluation committee were funded. We are hoping with the changes to the application we will have more grant applicants in 2023-24. Each applicant can request up to \$1500 in funding and each teacher can apply for two grants per year. The grants are available for teachers Augusta County, Staunton City, and Waynesboro City. A team of community members and educators evaluate the grants. This is a blind process, so the evaluators don't have any identifiable information. We've had amazing grants and hope for another great pool of grants this year.


