Saturday 1st

"Now Esther was admired by all who saw her." Esther 2:15

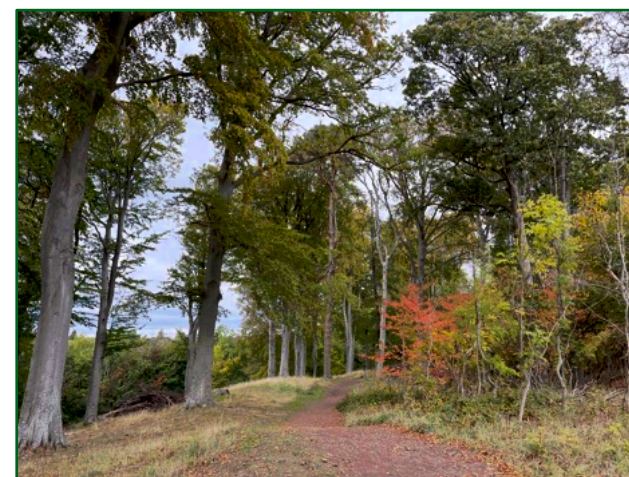

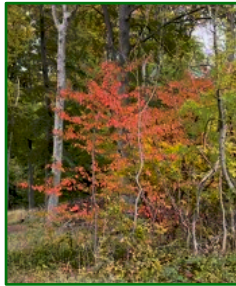


Saturday 15th
