Mr & Mrs Wallaby... to err is Human!

Some images of animals almost seem to require speech bubble (s), and those that do so successfully can make us roar with laughter. We invite you to provide us with some funny ones for this image, and if they're good enough we may be able to put them into our July Newsletter. Overlaying human character onto animals is something that goes back into the mists of time. The Bible authors have reflected actual animal to human communication,



both evil and good, cf. Genesis 3:1, Numbers 22:28. Both of these events ironically reveal deep flaws in humanity (Hebrew *adam*).

The people of Israel experienced God's miracle after miracle after miracle, as we read in Exodus, and yet even they did wrong. They:

Ш	were literally freed from centuries of slavery;
	had the opportunity to take the Egyptian's gold, silver, clothing;
	followed a pillar of cloud by day and fire by night;
	escaped across a sea by walking over its bed;
	watched the incredibly powerful Egyptian army chasing them brought to nothing;
	were provided with food, water, and clothing that did not wear out; (Deuteronomy 8v4,
	Nehemiah 9v21)
	saw and heard God's glory at the top of Mount Sinai;
	agreed to do all God commanded and become a nation of priests;
	agreed to God's Ten Commandments and ordinances about life;
	were sealed with the Blood of the Covenant
1	then—despite all the above—forty days later they broke the Covenant!

Most of us are all too familiar with this painful disobedience of the people of Israel. Following this deep betrayal, fewer of us may be aware of the amazing character description that God speaks to Moses (Exodus 34v6); which is so important that it is re-quoted in scripture more than any other. I have put together a Bible study, with short videos and articles, on this amazing description of God's character based on material from the BibleProject. I am sharing this with two Home Groups; one of which is a brand-new Home Group. The study also tackles some challenging and intriguing questions such as: "If God Hardened Pharaoh's Heart, Did God Cause the Evil?", "Can We Trust God in Difficult Times?", "The Sins of Our Fathers!", "God is Like a Nursing Mother!"

If you are not in a Home Group yet and have wondered about joining one, then we have a couple of places in the new one. So, why not try this study and let's open God's living word together, just let me know.

Do you know what you can recycle in your blue bin? It can be very confusing! Recently we had heavy plastic and paint tins put in ours. Not good!

Full details are at: https://www.midlothian.gov.uk/info/1054/bins_and_recycling/377/blue_bin/2 but in brief you can only recycle clean containers such as:

Food tins and drink cans - YES TO: Soft drink cans -Soup cans - Food cans e.g. baked bean tins -Large metal tins (such as empty biscuit and chocolate tins).

Plastic food and drink packaging, YES TO: - Plastic bottles, plus lids - Plastic tubs, pots, trays and punnets. **BUT NOT:** Hard plastic items such as coat-hangers, toys, plant pots, CD/DVD/video cases, nor plastic bags.
