Life... unexpectedly reassuring... worryingly challenging!

There's always change in life. Sometimes it's unexpectedly reassuring and sometimes it's worryingly challenging. All of us know what a tortoise is, many of us will have experience of them as pets. Ironically, we don't see them in TV wildlife. We see Killer Whales and Eagles, Elephants and Crocodiles, occasionally a Galapagos Giant Tortoise. However, a few weeks ago I saw a wild tortoise in a peaceful ravine slowly chewing on tree debris; unexpectedly re-assuring.



What reassures you? What is behind your life plans? How do you cope with change? What does the Bible say about life? From the start of October, we are running a series of Life Explored experiences, looking through the Bible starting in Genesis and ending in Revelation. We're using interactive sessions centred around a collection of silent films from across the world creating "Nathan Moments"; as the prophet Nathan did for King David in 2 Samuel 12... worryingly challenging.

Life Explored offers the opportunity to consider varied questions that help us understand our search for fulfilment, and Jesus's offer of life in all its fullness. It's for confused Christians, convinced atheists, and everybody in between, providing a time to discover what Jesus has to say about the big questions of life that we wrestle with.

Lasting about an hour, from 7.30pm in Cranstoun, we'll watch a short Nathan Moment video and share our reaction to it, watch a video commentary on it, and then share a reading and discussion questions contrasting the God of the Bible with "gods" we all too easily give our lives to instead.
