## ANNUAL REPORT FROM THE TREASURER

Income is down on 2020, due in part to the reduction in Sunday offerings. In 2020 we had a normal pattern of services until mid-March and averaged over £700 per month in Sunday offerings over the first 3 months. Up to the end of May 2021 we are averaging only about £330 per month in Sunday offerings, including contributions received from members to replace their usual Sunday donations. Standing order and one-off donations are also lower than in 2020.

However, expenditure so far is also down on 2020, mainly due to the sale of Borthwick Church and the consequent reduction in insurance and heating costs, and also the reduction in Ministry and Mission costs this year. We have incurred extra costs in 2021 due to COVID-19, viz additional cleaning and the installation of broadband at Cranstoun Church.

Overall our situation is still fairly healthy, but unless our income increases we may end in a deficit position for the year. Thank-you to everyone who is contributing. Your contributions are much appreciated and are essential to the running of the church.

### Kazunzu Village of Hope Update

The development activities at the Kazunzu Village of Hope continue to make good progress with the first two clusters, each with four houses, now complete.

These eight homes are the first of 40 that are planned for the village. The farmland (shambas) connected at the back of the clusters has also been completed. Farming will provide a range of different benefits to the village, including a sustainable food source and income for the families, as well as training opportunities in the local community.

A total of 58 people now live in the homes, with the guardian parents serving as foster families to 4 or 5 orphaned children from the islands or lake zone.

These 8 houses are home to 34 orphaned children, having been identified by the church (AICT) in partnership with local community leaders and social services. Reports from the residents reveal that, since moving into their new homes, a real sense of community has been developed at Kazunzu.
