Re: Notification of FY2023 Continuum of Care Competition and Noncompetitive Award of Youth Homeless Demonstration Program Renewal and Replacement Grants

On August 7, 2023, HUD announced the FY 2023 CoC Program Competition with an application due date of September 28, 2023. Agencies wanting to apply for renewal or new projects should read the NOFO at this [link](#) and follow the process outlined below.

HUD has not announced its funding amounts for specific CoCs. We anticipate opportunities for renewals, bonus dollars, Domestic Violence bonus dollars, and CoC planning grants. Additional information will be provided as soon as possible.

APPLICATION TIMELINE HIGHLIGHTS (see table on page 3 for full details)

- Applicants requesting funding for new projects should express their intent to apply to the Wendi Counta at wendi@yolohpac.org no later than **5:00 pm on August 21, 2023**.
- Project applicants will be notified regarding the status of their application (including approval or denial and ranking if approved) no later than **5:00 pm on September 13, 2023**.
- Eligible applicants must submit a project application in the [e-snaps system](#) no later than **5:00 pm on August 28, 2023**.

APPLICANT ELIGIBILITY

All applicants must have an active:

- Unique Entity Identifier (UEI) – which has replaced DUNS
- Registration in the System for Award Management (SAM)

In addition, all programs funded by this grant must participate in the HUD-mandated Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) and Coordinated Entry.

Applicable Goals and Objectives from HUD's Strategic Plan

1. Support Underserved Communities: Fortify support for underserved communities and support equitable community development for all people.
2. Ensure Access to and Increase the Production of Affordable Housing: Ensure housing demand is matched by adequate production of new homes and equitable access to housing opportunities for all people.
3. Promote Homeownership: Promote homeownership opportunities, equitable access to credit for purchase and improvements, and wealth-building in underserved communities.
4. Advance Sustainable Communities: Advance sustainable communities by strengthening climate resilience and energy efficiency, promoting environmental justice, and recognizing housing's role as essential to health.

- Ending homelessness for all persons
- Using a Housing First approach
- Reducing unsheltered homelessness
- Improving system performance
- Racial equity
- Improving Assistance to LGBTQ+ individuals

RENEWAL AND NEW PROJECTS

For Renewal and New projects, see NOFO for its many details, restrictions, and rules. If your project is funded, you will be required to document matching funds (25% cash or in-kind) and agree to comply with all HUD guidelines and regulations.

Programs eligible for renewals include:

- Permanent Housing and Permanent Supportive Housing
- Permanent Housing / Rapid Rehousing / Supportive Services Only for Coordinated Entry (SSO)
- Joint Transitional Housing-Rapid Rehousing
- Renewal projects originally awarded under a previous year's DV Bonus must continue to serve survivors of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking who qualify as homeless.

New projects may be funded through fund reallocation, CoC Bonus funds (or a combination of allocated funds and bonus dollars), new DV Bonus funds, and/or funds allocated for a CoC planning project. New projects may include:

- PH-PSH projects
- PH-RRH projects
- Joint TH/PH-RRH component projects
- Dedicated HMIS projects carried out by the HMIS lead
- SSO-CE projects
- New DV Bonus projects

New projects for DV Bonus may include:

- Joint JT/PH-RRH projects
- PH-RRH projects
- SSO-CE projects

RANKING AND SCORING

HPAC will approve a rating and ranking tool and a selection process based on HUD guidelines in the NOFO. HPAC will make this information public by August 23.

For your information, the HUD threshold requirements include:

- Coordinated Entry Participation
- Housing First Implementation
