From the Pastor...

Dear Family and Friends of Mexico First UMC;

At the end of a recent Sunday morning worship service, we sang "Let There Be Peace on Earth." By the end of the song, a few little circles of people holding hands and singing together had spontaneously popped up. It was a beautiful sight that portrayed unity within our congregation.

"How good and pleasant it is when God's people live together in unity!" proclaims the psalmist in Psalm 133:1. One of my study Bibles refers to this verse as a celebration of community – a proclamation of a good thing that is occurring within a group of people.

It seems hard to live in unity sometimes. We can always find things about which to disagree and things that we would like different. Sometimes it seems like there are more things to separate us than to hold us together! Yet, unity is not being "cookie-cutter Christians" who are all identical. We can be united without all thinking or doing the same things. In fact, our differences make life more interesting and allow us to experience new ways of sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ with the world around us.

So if we all have different ways of thinking and doing things, what (or more accurately who) does hold us together in unity? Jesus Christ is the one who unifies us as Christians. Just think about our name for a moment – Christian. The word means someone who follows Jesus Christ and his teachings. Our spiritual life is focused on Jesus Christ, the Savior.

If we all are focused on the same person – Jesus – then our differences can provide different ways of seeing and knowing Jesus' teachings. Sometimes another person's perspective helps us understand better. Sometimes the way someone else does something helps us learn a new way of loving others. Following Jesus Christ can be difficult and we all need each other on the journey!

Think about some of the different committees in our church, each one focused on their part of fulfilling our mission to "make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world." We have different committees to plan worship, organize outreach events, and help our church grow stronger. Each one of those three areas is part of following Christ. We worship; we help others; and we build the body of believers. Each committee has a part in our overall mission as a church – helping other people know Jesus Christ.

That is unity that pleases God. We allow our differences to enhance our lives with each other, rather than separating us. We follow Jesus together, rather than separately. Unity means we love each other, because God loved us enough to give us a Savior.

All members are welcome. Church leaders are strongly encouraged to attend.

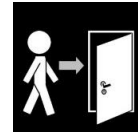

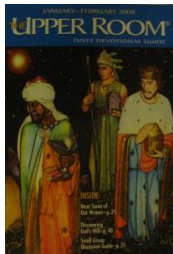

Applesauce Cake

1 cup sugar
1/2 cup butter
2 cups flour
2 tsp baking soda

1 1/2 cups sweetened plain applesauce
1/2 teaspoon nutmeg
1 teaspoon cinnamon
1 teaspoon cloves



Mix well with mixer. Pour into 9x13 greased pan. Bake on 350 until cake springs back. (Approx. 35 minutes). Sprinkle confectioners' sugar on top.

OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD SHOEBOX UPDATE...

As of September 22, all shoebox items donated have been sorted and stored. Those items that are in good supply are pencils, pens and stuffed animals and crayons. All other materials are still needed, but the most dire item is toothbrushes. As of this date I have 30 (yes, thirty) toothbrushes. We can use soap, washcloths, small toys, socks, band aids, hair ribbons, combs, tools, trucks and cars, hats and mittens, and t-shirts – as well as elastic thread for making bracelets. The collection item for October is light-weight backpacks and anything else you think a child between 2 and 14 years old could use. Sorry, no toothpaste, candy, or anything liquid can be sent.

I am also looking for volunteers to divide packages of loose leaf paper into groups of 35, and rolling them into toilet paper or paper towel rolls. This can be done at home. I will bring the paper and rolls to church on September 30. Anyone can pick up the materials and return them to us before October 28.

Thank you for all the support you provide the church with this project. Who knows what effect you may make on a child's life? God does.

Commission on the Way Forward

The United Methodist denomination was formed in 1968 by the merger of the Evangelical United Brethren Churches and the Methodist Churches. Almost from the beginning, the United Methodists have been debating the issue of human sexuality, specifically what we now refer to as same-sex attraction. The debate about marriage and ordination of people who are “self-avowed practicing homosexuals” is currently dividing the denomination.

Every four years our denomination has a General Conference which is the decision-making body of the United Methodist Church. The Commission on the Way Forward was formed following the 2016 General Conference to find a way to resolve our differences. The Commission is composed of eight bishops, 13 other clergy members, and 11 lay members. They will present their report at a special world-wide General Conference that will take place in February 2019. The Upper New York Conference Bishop Mark Webb is holding informational meetings about the Commission, their report, and the special General Conference. Bishop Webb will provide more information about the 2019 Conference process, a reminder about our mission to make disciples for the transformation of the world, and a time of worship and prayer. This meeting is **October 21, 4-6pm**, at Liverpool UMC, 604 Oswego Street, Liverpool, NY. The meeting is open to everyone who is interested in this topic and the future of the United Methodist Church.
