A message from Pastor Brandín

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I send greetings and blessings in the name of our risen Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. I want to wish a blessed and joyous Easter to you and yours.

I typically approach Resurrection Sunday with a sense of anticipation and wonder each year. Yet, when it comes to Easter Sunday over the years, I have had a difficult time remembering a message I shared on Easter Sunday. It is other things that I remember more. I recall other memories that show themselves in the "Befores and Afters" of Easter worship. I recall choirs singing and bells playing along with all of the other incredible songs that Lent and Holy Week bring. I recall all of the flowers where my family would take pictures after Easter Sunday services in front of the church. I remember taking home Easter lilies and planting them. My family and I hope to see all the children for our first of many, "Annual Easter Egg Hunts at the Parsonage" and we wish all of you the most blessed of Easter holidays.
