From the Pastor...

Dear Family and Friends of Mexico First United Methodist Church,

Grace and Peace to you in the name of our beloved Savior, Jesus who is the Christ.

As the cold, gray days of winter melt away, we're beginning to smile and relax as spring begins to appear. Although this was not a particularly long or harsh winter, many of us are relieved to put away our winter coats and stop battling ice and snow. We rejoice to feel the sunshine of spring, see the flowers peep through the ground and burst into blooms, and smile at the cute baby animals appearing in our yards. All of these are signs of new life after the dullness of winter.

Signs are objects that point us to something intangible in our faith. They often remind us of the bigger and deeper meaning behind the object. One of my seminary professors, Dr. Bob Stamps, would often say, "Faith needs something to do, and faith needs something to touch." Our faith is not just something we think or feel; it is lived out in action. Signs allow our faith to become tangible. Formal signs of our faith include: the bread and juice of Communion and the waters of baptism.

We can also see the new blooming flowers and baby animals as informal signs and reminders of the new life Jesus brings through his Resurrection from the grave. After his crucifixion on the cross, Jesus' disciples laid him in a tomb and were lost in grief and confusion. They did not see hope for the future now that their leader was dead. Yet in an awesome never-seen-before occurrence, Jesus rose from the grave completely and bodily resurrected. He wasn't merely resuscitated from a brief brush with death. Jesus was in the grave three days before returning to life. This is resurrection, proving Jesus is the Son of God and allowing we who follow Jesus to be given eternal life with God. This is something to celebrate!

But we don't get to the joy of the Resurrection without traveling through some darkness first. How can we know joy without first experiencing pain? Without realizing what we have lost we cannot celebrate finding. The six weeks of Lent are intended to help us face our sins and acknowledge that we do need a Savior. We cannot remove the sin from our lives, yet Jesus can and does so that we can enter the presence of God.

Holy Week begins April 14th with Palm Sunday. Our worship service that morning will begin with our children processing around the sanctuary with palms, reminding us that Jesus entered Jerusalem as a king. On Friday April 19th at 7:00 p.m. we are hosting a community Good Friday service when the scriptures telling of Jesus' final hours will be read. This is a solemn service, ending in darkness. And on Sunday April 21st we will celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ in a joyful celebratory service.

I invite you to join us for any or all of these services that remind us of the reality of Jesus Christ.

An Anniversary Observed

A Pastor's Journey to Share

On March 10th we marked the one-year anniversary when our Staff Pastor Parish Relations Committee, SPPRC, first met our new Pastor, Grace Warren, or as we know her, Pastor Grace. How time flies by. It seems like only yesterday that it was July 2018, when Pastor Grace assumed full responsibilities of ministering to our Church. The journey in miles from her previous home, in Western New York, to our church was over 200 miles. A journey traveled and a position accepted and so thankfully appreciated by the members of our church.

For some it may be a simple observation, but for most it is with joy, support, and anticipation that we see the progress of another journey. Pastor Grace's journey toward becoming an ordained minister, a United Methodist Elder. This journey started prior to our knowledge in 2012 with her decision, schooling, and extensive training, and Grace's service as a local church pastor. Now we can see the further steps that are required of Pastor Grace for the completion of this journey. SPPRC, has been informed of required meetings, scheduled training, along with the vast amounts of study and papers to be submitted. The commitment required for this journey is impressive.

Within the last few weeks Pastor Grace accomplished a MAJOR milestone that validated her hard work and will lead to the goal of being a fully ordained Elder. On March 3rd Pastor Grace completed the process of the submission of a massive amount of paper work which included:

- Answering sixteen questions from paragraph 324.9 of the Book of Discipline that reveal her personal theology and understanding of pastoral ministry.
- Writing a 6 week Bible study.
- Completing miscellaneous forms verifying information needed by the Church.
- Completed a day-long interview process with the Board of Ordained Ministry.

At a ceremony on June 8th, Pastor Grace will be commissioned as a Provisional Elder and will no longer be considered a Licensed Local Pastor. The congregation is welcomed to attend this ceremony, which will be in Syracuse. The final Ordination process will be a minimum of two years and a maximum of eight years before Grace is Ordained as an Elder. In this provisional time, along with continued training, she will need to demonstrate that she is capable of making disciples of Jesus Christ. Grace's personal target date for Ordination is 2022.

Pastor Grace, may we share our joy in your success to date. We look eagerly (with God's Grace and Joy) toward the day, when we will celebrate your goal of becoming an Ordained Elder.

RECIPES from CHURCH MEMBERS...

Rosa Marina Salad

Ingredients

- 1 (16 ounce) box Rosa Marina (orzo) pasta
- 2 (15 ounce) cans mandarin oranges, drained and juice reserved 1 (16 ounce) can pineapple chunks, drained with juice reserved 3/4 cup white sugar
- 2 large eggs
- 3 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 1 (16 ounce) container whipped topping (such as Cool Whip)
- 1 jar of cherries (optional for garnish) Walnuts (optional)

Directions

Bring a large pot of lightly salted water to a boil. Cook orzo in the boiling water, stirring occasionally until cooked through but firm to the bite, about 11 minutes. Drain and transfer to a large bowl.

Combine sugar, eggs, flour in a saucepan over medium heat. Stirring often, bring to a boil. Add 2 cups of the reserved juice and continue stirring and bring to a boil.

Pour cooked sauce over the orzo pasta, stirring well to incorporate. Cover with lid or foil and store in the refrigerator overnight. Store the pineapple and mandarin oranges in a container in the refrigerator overnight.

The next day, drain excess juice from mandarin oranges and pineapple in bowl, mix into the orzo mixture adding the whipped topping. Stir well.

Top with cherries and walnuts if desired.

Recipe Tips

- Read the recipe fully before starting to make sure you have everything you need.
- Prep before you start makes cooking and baking easier.
- Test new recipes before making for a special occasion.
- Taste as you go add seasoning if needed
