Blessing Box

Brown Memorial United Methodist Church Community Meal

We had the opportunity to make, bake and take a hearty meal to our Syracuse neighbors on Sunday, September 18. Each Sunday, prior to their 4 p.m. praise and worship service, a meal is provided to church and community members. The meals are provided by various churches and groups, with our church being one of many assisting in a ministry that provides food and fellowship. Everyone was very appreciative of the meal. No one left hungry; takeout dinners were distributed to more community members, after school programs were provided with snacks, kids were hugged and there were many smiles – all because of you! Shoe boxes for Red Bird Mission

This year we are filling adult and children's shoeboxes for Red Bird Mission, located in Beverly, Kentucky (http://rbmission.org/) Red Bird Mission serves an isolated, rural region of the Appalachian Mountains which is impacted by persistent poverty, inadequate employment opportunities, insufficient housing and geographical challenges.

Items needed for the adult shoe boxes include a comb/brush, shampoo, hand lotion, deodorant, toothbrush, toothpaste, chapstick, full size bath soap, wash cloth, disposable razors, shaving cream, nail care supplies, mittens, scarf, hat, socks and work gloves. Please indicate if the box is for a man or woman.

Items needed for the children's shoe boxes include two or three toy items, two or three school items, bar soap, children's toothbrush, children's toothpaste, shampoo, lotion, wash cloth, comb/brush, chapstick, mittens, hat, socks and small flashlight. Please indicate if the box is for a boy or girl.

Christian bookmarks, wrist bands or other spiritual items can also be included and all items must be placed in a **clear** shoe box. Some clear shoe boxes will be available for individuals to fill along with a collection bin for items in mid-October.


