

Cereal, cereal and more cereal needed, peanut/nut butters, toiletries along with shelf-stable milk (the Dollar Tree oftentimes has it in stock for \$1.25 per box). Themes will be shared in forthcoming bulletins, however; as October, November and December lend themselves to change, gratitude and God's gift to us with Jesus's birth, consider donating anything orange, a Thanksgiving graciousness offering personal to you, or baby necessities (diapers, wipes, rice cereal, baby food, infant/child toothbrushes/toothpaste, shampoos/soaps, trash liners and cleansing wipes).

Operation Christmas Child / Samaritan's Purse: The Samaritan's Purse project, Operation Christmas Child, collects shoebox gifts filled with fun toys, school supplies and hygiene items and delivers them to children in need around the world to demonstrate God's love in a tangible way. 
Christmas in Mexico 2024


