From the Pastor...

Dear Family and Friends of Mexico First United Methodist Church,

Grace and Peace to you in the name of our beloved Savior, Jesus who is the Christ.

Have you ever noticed the sign in Fellowship Hall that states our mission? The sign says our church mission is "To make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world." Some of us can rattle that mission statement off without a pause or stumbling over any of the words. We know it by rote, but do we think about what it means for each of us as individuals or for us as a church?

This mission statement comes from ¶120 in the United Methodist Book of Discipline and introduces the section on the purpose of the Church as a whole. We are a community of people called by God to make disciples of Jesus Christ. It is the disciples going out (and that includes us!) who change the world to reveal God's grace, mercy, and love to the people around us.

The United Methodist Church didn't come up with this out of thin air. It is drawn from Matthew 28:18-20, which is known as the Great Commission. After the Resurrection and before the Ascension, Jesus met with the eleven original disciples and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

The concept of "making disciples" is the main instruction in both of these statements. The Book of Discipline goes on to say that "Local churches provide the most significant arena through which disciple-making occurs." That means our church community in Mexico has an important part in this mission that comes directly from Jesus!

But what is a disciple? How do you know if you really are one? And how do you make one? I haven't seen any recipes for disciples in the cookbooks on my kitchen shelf, nor do craft magazines include diagrams and instructions. Perhaps it isn't that simple, yet with the Holy Spirit leading and working through us, disciple making is less overwhelming than we think.

We will be spending time this summer looking at discipleship. I'll be preaching a sermon series during July and August on "Living as Disciples" so we can all grow in our understanding of discipleship.

I invite you all to join me on Thursday nights in August to dig a little deeper into the concept of making disciples. Together we can begin thinking about how God is calling Mexico First to make disciples of Jesus Christ. It is always helpful to have a plan for our work and all the churches in Upper New York Conference have been asked to create one to present at our annual Charge Conference this autumn. We can work on this plan together so that it is filled with the different ideas and viewpoints of our church. Our plan will be richer and better with all of us working together.

Bar-B-Que Pulled Pork

In a crock pot place 2 pork tenderloins. Pour in one bottle of coke and one bottle of your favorite barbeque sauce. (I use Sweet Baby Rays Honey BBQ).

Let it cook for 6-7 hours, stirring occasionally. Pull the pork apart and add $\frac{1}{2}$ cup more of BBQ sauce and let it cook for another 30 minutes. Then it's ready to place on a bun and enjoy.

Coleslaw

6 cups shredded green cabbage

2 cups shredded red cabbage

1 cup shredded carrots

3/4 cup mayonnaise

3 tbsp apple cider vinegar

1 tbsp mustard - optional

1/2 tsp salt

1/4 tsp freshly ground black pepper

Place the cabbage and carrots in a very large mixing bowl.

In a small bowl, whisk to combine the mayonnaise, apple cider vinegar, mustard if using, salt, and pepper.

Pour the dressing all over the cabbage and toss well to combine.
