From the Pastor...

Dear Family and Friends of Mexico First United Methodist Church,

Grace and peace to you in the Name of our Savior Jesus Christ.

I've been thinking about the nature and mission of the Church lately. Not merely our local church here in Mexico; I've also been thinking about the United Methodist Church too. Looking across the globe we see the Church in Africa thriving, and the Church in the Middle East under attack. We sometimes seem so different in our contexts that it may be difficult to remember we are all one. Yet Colossians 1:18 says that "Christ is the head of the body, the church." We are all connected to Christ through the Church, and therefore connected to one another. Jesus Christ is the leader of the Church, not any human being. It is Jesus who guides us and provides the example and teaching to follow.

Acts 2 tells us how the Church was formed on the day of Pentecost. The Holy Spirit descended and drew all those who believe in Jesus Christ together into one entity known as the Church. This includes everyone across the world and across time who has ever declared Jesus is Lord. Our purpose is to proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ to the world. We share the Good News of freedom from sin and death to the people around us who need hope and love. The Church allows us to gather together and worship God, reminding ourselves of God's goodness and love so we have the spiritual strength for our own lives.

If you follow news about our denomination, it is no secret that we have been struggling for years with the issue of same-sex weddings and clergy ordinations. We have been wrestling with interpreting scripture alongside our own experiences and church traditions that stretch back 2,000 years. As we reason things out, we have found ourselves arguing with each other. When we take sides and pour our energy into the disagreement, Jesus Christ gets pushed to the sidelines. We lose our focus as a part of the larger body of Christ.

As I consider the state of the church, I also reflect on my role as a pastor. This year I am making a personal commitment to intentionally look for Jesus Christ in the midst of daily life. Where is Jesus leading me as a person and a pastor? Where is Jesus leading our local church in Mexico? How are we, as individuals and a church community, called to reveal the Gospel to the village of Mexico? At the end of this year, what spiritual success stories will we be celebrating? How will we grow spiritually and be closer to Jesus Christ at the end of this year?

In regards to the United Methodist Church, I've included another article in this newsletter about the upcoming Special Session of General Conference. Please be in prayer for the Bishops, delegates, and everyone involved in that meeting later this month. Then focus on Jesus who is the Christ who redeems us and makes us whole.

Update on Special Session of General Conference – February 23 – 26, 2019

The United Methodist Church has been discussing the issue of human sexuality for almost half a century. As a denomination, we have wrestled with issues related to same-gender weddings and clergy ordination, as well as Biblical interpretation and unity. Our conversation came to a head at the 2016 General Conference, leading the Council of Bishops to create The Commission on a Way Forward. This 32-member commission composed of clergy and laity from around the world spent over a year meeting, studying, and praying before creating a report for the Council of Bishops. This report contains three possible plans to resolve the impasse within the United Methodist Church. The three plans are:

The One Church Plan: This plan, preferred by a majority of the Council of Bishops, would remove restrictive language from the Book of Discipline that prohibits same-gender weddings in UMC properties and ordination of "self-avowed, practicing homosexuals." It would add language to protect churches and pastors who choose not to allow same-gender marriage.

Connectional Conference Plan (CCs): This plan would replace the current jurisdictional conferences with three connectional conferences based on affinity: Progressive, Traditional, and Unity. All three would use a general Book of Discipline (Articles of Religion, General Rules, Confessions of Faith) with the ability to adapt other portions to their context for ministry.

Traditionalist Plan: This plan, developed more fully toward the end of the Commission on a Way Forward process, broadens the definition of "self-avowed, practicing homosexual"; puts penalties in place for disobedience to the Discipline; and requires bishops, pastors, and annual conferences to certify adherence to the Discipline.

The Council of Bishops called for a Special Session of General Conference on February 23-26, 2019 to vote on these plans. General Conference occurs every four years and this is only the second time a Special Session has been held. The hope is that whatever structural change is adopted will resolve the conflict within the denomination. Please be in prayer for this Special Session and the future of the United Methodist Church.

RECIPE CORNER: These cookies are

from the kitchen of Fern Craner (Muriel DeLong's mother). Muriel made these cookies recently to share at a recent coffee hour. The recipe will work well for heart shaped Valentine's Day cookies. Thanks for sharing Muriel!

Old Fashioned Sugar Cookies

Preheat oven to 375 degrees.

Cream together in a large bowl:

1 cup shortening---butter flavored Crisco works really well.

2 cups sugar

2 eggs

1 tsp. Vanilla

1 cup sour cream

In another bowl combine:

4 to 5 cups flour. (Drop cookies only need 4 cups, Cut-outs need 5 cups)

1 tsp baking soda

2 tsp baking powder

½ tsp salt

Add to first mixture gradually until all blended. Cover dough with plastic wrap placing the wrap air tightly on the dough. Chill for at least several hours or overnight.

Place cookies on greased cookie sheets. Before baking drop cookies (by well-rounded tablespoon fulls), sprinkle a little sugar on each and dot with 2 or 3 chocolate chips or raisins.

For cut-out cookies-pat or roll dough to not less than ¼ inch thickness. Generously flour your surface before placing dough and sprinkle dough with flour before patting/ rolling out.

Bake at 375 degrees for 10 to 12 minutes taking care to not over bake. Overly brown cookies may not retain their softness. This recipes makes a lot of cookies. You may want to halve the recipe or store half the dough in the refrigerator for up to a week.

Dear friends, January 7, 2019

Happy holiday season to you! I pray that you and your loved ones have enjoyed a blessed celebration of Christmas, and a safe and joyful New Year!

It has been a blessing to celebrate the holiday season here in Kyiv, where both Western and Orthodox Christian communities have been gathering for traditional worship services to mark the holy season.

Yesterday I led an ecumenical worship service celebrating Epiphany, when the miracle of Christmas—God taking human flesh, incarnate in Jesus—was first revealed to the world. The Magi visited Jesus in Bethlehem, honored him as their Lord and King, and then went out to share this good news to the world. It was a privilege for me to preach, celebrate Holy Communion, and lead the gathered community in worship on this holy day.

And today, here in Ukraine and in Orthodox communities worldwide that follow the Julian calendar, faithful Christians are celebrating Christmas Day! Last night and throughout the day today around the country, Orthodox believers are gathering to give thanks to God for the birth of Jesus, the Savior of the world.

Every night throughout this holiday season here in Kyiv, thousands of people have gathered at St. Sophia's Square, outside a cathedral dating back to the 11th century, to celebrate the season. As the lights of the tree and cathedral belfry shine brightly, we are reminded of the light of Christ that burst forth into the dark world on that first Christmas in Bethlehem.

As we enter this new year, I pray God's blessings on you and your loved ones. May the joy of this season remain with you throughout the coming year. May the light of Christ shine brightly within you, so that you may be a witness of God's love to the world. Through you, may others come to know Jesus our Lord, whose birth long ago in Bethlehem we celebrate in these holy days.
