The United Methodist Men's Club will hold their famous roast pork dinner on *Saturday*, *October 25 from 4:00 – 6:00 p.m.* 


Menu will include slow-roasted pork, mashed potatoes, squash, homemade stuffing and delicious desserts.

# **Mission Outreach Committee News by Carol Watros**

We met in July; voted to financially assist Operation Reindeer, Brown Memorial Church's Christmas Store, and those helping two local families with immediate needs. We also purchased various food and personal hygiene items for the Blessing Box, which continues to be a staple in the community.

- Operation Christmas Child: We are collecting items to assemble gift-filled Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes for Samaritan's Purse. Collection week will be November 17-24 and boxes we pack will be taken to a local collection site. These shoeboxes are distributed to children around the world; we will offer the congregation an opportunity to fill boxes during coffee hour later this fall. You can also fill a box and bring it to church. When packing a shoebox, please include a "wow" item, school supplies and personal care item, and if possible, a personal note and a prayer for the recipient.
- The following items are not allowed in shoeboxes: soap, candy, toothpaste, gum, used or damaged items; scary or war-related items such as toy guns, knives, or military figures; chocolate or food; seeds, fruit rolls or other fruit snacks, drink mixes (powdered or liquid), liquids or lotions, medications or vitamins, breakable items such as snow globes or glass containers, aerosol cans.
- <u>Blessing Box</u>: We appreciate any and all donations; please consider purchasing the following items as we broach cooler days:
  - o Canned goods: chili, meats, soups, stews, tuna
  - o October is National Apple, Corn and Seafood Month
  - November is National Gluten Free, Peanut Butter and Skin Safety Month
  - December think about filling a box with one item a day and bringing it to church at the end of the month to greet the New Year. More to come in the bulletin.


