MISSION OUTREACH: Blessing Box: Seven for September 7

On behalf of Outreach we ask for folks to consider purchasing seven items this month to help fill the Blessing Box pantry. Yes, we know September has 9 letters, but it originates from 'septem' (seven in Latin), as September used to be the 7th month.

- sauce (salsa, tomato, soy, steak)
- soup (canned, packaged)
- soap (body, dish, laundry)
- spaghetti (or any other pasta, canned or dry)
- stew, sausage, sardines, salami (canned - or any canned meat)
- sweets (sweet relish, pickles, sugar, stevia, suckers (lollipops), sweet tarts)
- cereal (isn't the English language fun?)

As an aside, September is Hunger Action Month, a national effort on behalf of Feeding America which partners with food banks to meet community hunger needs (and less hungry does not mean full). If one child, elder, human and yes, pet, has a belly or body with fewer pangs for the evening, our mission is well served. We assume positive intentions; do not judge and keep filling the box. Many of us have heard how this simple wooden structure has given a meal, filled a need, or provided a pure sense of relief for the moment. Thank you for the difference you make.

Crayons for Kids/Operation Christmas Child: Some of us are old enough to remember wanting a box of new crayons. I was so excited when in the 4th grade, I received my very first Crayola 64 Count Box of crayons. Many of my friends had them, and I was filled with joy to have a box filled with choices to explore, express, and emote, even though I was never very good at staying in the lines or conforming to a set of 'art rules'. I did not get any 'A's and the best my parents could hope for was 'improving'. However, this is not about me; this is about children throughout the world living in trauma, sensory deprivation - **a colorless world**. Wouldn't it be wonderful if every shoebox filled from our congregation had at least one box of new crayons, and perhaps two, along with a sketch pad, so that we, through the grace of God, can bring some brightness to humanity.
