Each year we strive to streamline the team registration process, making it easier for everyone to register, order uniforms and communicate with each other. Once the team began to take shape, we started a Team Canada Facebook group to share new information as it became available. The team Canada fundraisers were a huge success and brought awareness to both he world championships. With Team Canada fundraising money, we provided gift cards to Source for Sports for athletes to order their gear, we had custom cards made with the CAWF logos on them and mailed them out to the team. All uniforms were shipped to the competitors directly.

We had a great team this year with 25 competitors and 4 referees! One of our objectives is to get repeat athletes back to the world championships each year so that they can grow as world competitor. We had 11 competitors that have been to a world championship before. This year Team Canada brought home 1 gold, 3 silver and 2 bronze medals. We were vey proud to see the flag on the podium and hear the national anthem played! Each year we see the athletes grow and the have the courage to train hard and come back better prepared. We hope that we will continue to improve as a country and see our flag on the podium again this year in Romania.

After the event, we had custom calendars created using photos taken in Turkey and mailed before Christmas so the athletes will have a reminder of the event all year long on their wall.4

For this year, we made an online registration and offered it to past competitors to pre-register. We have several athletes that are registered pending their attendance and performance at nationals.

- It was noted that Rick decided to join IFA as a referee (individual), not as President of Canada. Rick did not notify anyone on the CAWF Board that this was his, until after it happened.
- WAF did send letter recognizing that Rick joined IFA, requesting Rick be suspended from the CAWF.
- Agreed to the vote and Joey will take results back to WAF. We will wait to hear back from WAF

Motion Joey makes a motion that the CAWF, executive and directors, move to suspend Rick for 1 year starting July 14<sup>th</sup>, 2019 at midnight. He will continue as staff and contribute to the speeches at Nationals. 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion: Steve L.

Vote: Majority opposed, Vote did not pass

Joey to notify WAF of Canada's decision to not suspend Rick.
