





10% of net income from CLRC is set aside each year for research in the following year.

Funding in 2024 to date: \$14,500

- CarLa Saliva Test for Parasite resistance (\$4500)
- Application of embryo technologies in pre-pubertal and pubertal animals for the acceleration of the genetic selection and expansion of the ovine sector. (\$5,000)
- Mitacs Accelerate Project: Improving Lamb Survival in Canadian Sheep (\$5,000)

- Prevention of Pregnancy Toxemia (Universite de Laval)







Initiatives & Membership Benefits

- Sheep Canada Magazine: Continued discount for CSBA membership.
- New Breed Recognition Incentive: The \$500 charge has been changed to a deposit that can be used for new registrations once approved.
- Junior memberships: \$20 for members under 21 years of age (regular is \$80).
- **Judging workbook for sheep**: Working on providing more education and information on sheep judging.
- Junior CSBA Director: Non-voting advisor role created for membership under 21 years of age. Iain Anderson joined in 2024 and the CSBA is grateful for his contributions to the board.
