All Canada Sheep Classic Rules

- 1. Consignors must be current (2025) members of the Canadian Sheep Breeders' Association.
- 2. All animals must be born on the property of the consignor and be a registered purebred with CSBA.
- 3. Breeders may enter as many ewes as they wish. Each ram entered and attending the Classic, requires the entry, and attendance, of one ewe. The ewe does not have to be the same breed as the ram. Where a ewe is culled by the Classic committee, the ram may remain in the show and sale.
- 4. Substitutions are only allowed **within the same class**. A maximum of two animals per breed is allowed. Substitutions made after the deadline but prior to **July 8, 2025** are done at a cost of \$5; substitutions made on site are done at a cost of \$10.
- 5. Animals must show in order to sell, and all animals shown must be offered for sale, unless disqualified due to injury or sickness.
- 6. Please enter online at www.sheepbreeders.ca using the Assist Expo platform. The online system links directly with the CLRC to make the entry process easier and accurate. At the time of entry, include GenOvis or Genomic testing results. Please bring your certificates to the sale.
 - If necessary, entries may be mailed to the CSBA office at 18-539 Willow Road, Guelph ON N1H 7G3, faxed to 1-877-207-2541, or scanned/emailed to office@sheepbreeders.ca
- 7. There is a \$30 entry fee for each animal.
- 8. Closing date for entries is Monday, May 12, 2025. No entries/changes/additions/deletions will be accepted after this date.
- 9. Entry fees may be paid online or by cheque, VISA or Mastercard or etransfer. Cheques should be made payable to the Canadian Sheep Breeders' Association and mailed to the CSBA office at 18-539 Willow Road, Guelph, ON N1H 7G3. Credit card information may be included with entry forms or phoned (1-866-956-1116) or faxed (1-877-207-2541) to the CSBA office. Etransfers can be sent to office@sheepbreeders.ca.
- 10. Entries that have not been paid for by May 12, 2025 will not be included in the sale catalogue.
- 11. Changes to animal information after deadline will be subjected to a \$5 administration fee prior to the event, this includes animals listed as "Information Available Show Day". Information received at the show will be subjected to a \$10 administrative fee.
- 12. A CSBA registration certificate, properly signed for transfer, must be provided for each entry to the sale committee at the time animals are going through the selection station. These verifications will include CSIP tags, tattoos, registration papers and lot number branding.

- 13. All animals will be subjected to the health and soundness evaluation by a veterinarian and the culling committee.
- 14. Consignors will show for ribbons only. Each breed shows separately.
- 15. Halters may be used. The exhibitors' dress code is black pants and a white shirt.
- 16. <u>The sale commission will be 15%</u>, with the following exceptions: the minimum commission on animals that sell will be \$60 and the maximum will be \$500. There is a \$400 Floor Price in place.
- 17. The auctioneer will manage reserve bids. In the case of no sale, commission will be charged on the reserve bid.
- 18. Consignors are not to bid up their own animals.
- 19. Failure to comply with the above rules will result in disqualification from the show and sale.

2025 All Canada Sheep Classes

Due to the enormous success of the online sales in the sheep industry over recent years, CSBA recommends that all Classic entries with the exception of Leicester, Lincoln, Romney, Cotsworld, Rambouillet, Columbia, Corriedale and Targhee, be slick shorn for pictures, videos and Classic sale. This process allows the buyers to see exactly what they are buying without varying fleece lengths.

The following breeds must be shown in short fleece (less than 1 inch or 2.4 cm): Canadian Arcott, Outaouais Arcott, Rideau Arcott, Border Cheviot, Charollais, Clun Forest, Dorper, Dorset, Hampshire, Ile de France, North Country Cheviot, Oxford Down, Polypay, Romanov, Shropshire, Southdown, Suffolk and Texel. Animals must be washed, dry and clean before inspection. Sheep will be culled if deemed to have greater than 1 inch of wool, or if dirty.

All Canada Sheep Classic 2025 Classes

Class 1: Yearling Ewe - Born Sept. 1 2023 to Aug. 31, 2024

Class 2: Fall Ewe Lamb - Born Sept. 1, 2024 to Dec. 31, 2024

Class 3: Spring Ewe Lamb - Born Jan. 1, 2025 to Mar. 15, 2025

Class 4: Yearling Ram - Born Sept. 1 2023 to Aug. 31, 2024

Class 5: Fall Ram Lamb - Born Sept. 1, 2024 to Dec. 31, 2024

Class 6: Spring Ram Lamb - Born Jan. 1, 2025 to Mar. 15, 2025

First pair of temporary incisors need to be intact to be considered for the spring/fall lambs. Otherwise, animal is moved to the yearling class.


Champion Flock: Four animals representing both sexes, previously shown in above classes, no entry or entry fee is required.

All Canada Sheep Classic - Terms & Conditions

ORDER OF SALE: Breeds will sell in the same order that they are listed in the show catalogue (alphabetical). Within each breed, the sale order will be Champion Ewe, yearling ewes, fall ewe lambs, spring ewe lambs, Champion Ram, yearling rams, fall ram lambs, spring ram lambs. Within each class, animals will be sold by the order of their placing in the show.

HEALTH AND SOUNDNESS: All animals will be rigidly assessed by the culling committee and/or the attending veterinarian and culled if necessary. Please inspect your animals carefully at home. The CSBA and the veterinarian do their best to ensure the health and soundness of animals during the selection at the show, they are not liable for conditions that may arise after the event.

The following list outlines some of the undesirable physical traits will serve as cause for an animal to be culled but does not exclude other reasons that an animal may be culled.

The veterinarian on site will assess the animal for:

- 1. Lameness
- 2. Presence of external parasites
- 3. Orf lesions
- 4. Abscess
- 5. Entropion
- 6. Scrotal malformation: will include palpation to ensure uniform testicles, the presence of epididymides, and scrotal circumference review
- 7. Body condition score of 2 or less
- 8. Any other condition that concerns the veterinarian


The Classic selection committee will assess the animal for:

- 1. Malocclusion / Dental Alignment
- 2. Tails must be docked at the end of the caudal fold and must cover the anus
- 3. Any other condition that concerns the committee

The CSBA Classic committee is authorized to settle any and all disputes regarding culling and to interpret the rules. The committee culls based on health and sale standards, not breed standards. Their decision will be final. All animals that have been culled must be immediately removed from the sale facility.

REGISTRATION CERTIFICATES: Original registration certificates must be signed on the back for transfer and submitted to the culling committee. This applies to all entries with no exception. Failure to supply the registration certificates will cause the animal to be excused from the sale without a refund of entry fee and the animal must be removed from the sale facility. Following the sale and financial settlement, the CSBA office will process transfers, and the cost will be deducted from the consignor's sale proceeds. The transferred registration paper will be sent directly to the buyer from the CLRC.

IDENTIFICATION: All consigned animals must either bear legible tattoos or paired CSIP tags. Confirmation that the identification stated on the registration paper is borne by the consigned animal is the responsibility of the culling committee. All consigned animals must bear a CSIP tag according to CFIA regulations. Animals failing to meet the identification standards will be culled from the sale and must be removed from the sale facility.

COMMISSION: Sale commission is 15%, with the following exceptions: the minimum commission on animals that sell will be \$60 and the maximum commission on animals that sell will be \$500. Sale commission will be deducted from the consignor's proceeds. There is a \$400 floor price in place.

BUYERS: Buyers must obtain a buyer's number from the salesclerk before they are eligible to bid in the auction. Buyers must provide their full name, address, telephone number and email address and indicate exactly how each animal is to be transferred.

TERMS: Payment may be made by cash, personal cheque, debit card, Visa or Mastercard or e-transfer. Animals will not be released from the sale facility until payment is processed. Registration papers will be transferred when personal cheques have cleared the bank. Any animals purchased by credit card (VISA/MC) will be subject to an additional 3% fee.

GUARANTEE: Each consignor guarantees clear right and title to all animals that present for sale.

All animals are guaranteed breeders, if properly handled.

All males are guaranteed breeders. Should any ram fail to prove to be a breeder, any claim for adjustment must be made within 18 months of the date of sale. A satisfactory settlement shall be deemed to be replacement with another ram of equal value and health status or refund of purchase price.

The seller shall have the right, if so desired, to try a ram for as much as 75 days to determine whether he is a satisfactory breeder, before making final adjustment.

All females are guaranteed breeders. Should any female 12 months of age or older, not pregnant at the time of sale, fail to become pregnant during the current breeding season, the purchaser has the right to claim adjustment in writing to the seller within 12 months of the sale. Should any female younger than 12 months of age and not pregnant at the time of sale, fail to become pregnant during the current breeding season, the purchaser should notify the seller within 12 months from the date of sale, but wait to see if the ewe again fails

to become pregnant by 24 months of age, before claiming adjustment in writing to the seller. Satisfactory settlement shall be deemed to be replacement with another ewe of equal value and health status or refund of purchase price.

The purchaser shall notify the seller as soon as any concern with an animal arises.

Exposed ewes of any age, even if marked prior to sale, are not guaranteed to be pregnant or produce living lambs.

Under no conditions will the seller be liable for more than the original purchase price of the animal.

The seller may direct the marketing of the animal and refund the difference between the purchase price and the market value as shown on the sales receipt.

No incidental expenses, such as feed, care, etc. will be charged by either party when making settlement.

All transportation charges are the responsibility of the buyer.

No settlement will be completed until the registration certificate is retired or endorsed and returned to the seller.

Any settlement of such guarantee is between the seller and buyer and is subject to the restrictions set out above. The Canadian Sheep Breeders' Association and the provincial Classic committee assume no responsibility, expressed or implied, with respect to this guarantee or the restrictions set out above.

RISK/REMOVAL: All animals are at purchaser's risk as soon as sold. Delivery must be taken at conclusion of sale. All animals must be removed from the barn by 8:00 PM on Saturday July 12, 2025.

ERRORS: If any errors are noted, corrections will be made from the auction stand. All announcements at sale time, written or oral, supersede any material written in this catalogue.

LIABILITY: The Canadian Sheep Breeders' Association and the Manitoba Sheep Association, and their directors, owners and employees accept no liability that may occur. Accidents at sheep sales are very rare, but all attending must do so at their own risk.

Selection Station

All sheep will go through the selection station which will involve inspection by the Classic veterinarian, verification of CSIP tags, tattoos and registration. This will also include lot number branding. Please be prepared to lead your animals to the inspection station during the allocated hours. If you need assistance, there will be people available to help. Please see the barn boss for assistance.

Please have your registration papers ready with your lot number written at the top right hand corner of your page. Make sure your papers are signed.
