Exporter Checklist

If you're looking to export animals, here are some tips to make the process go as smooth and quick as possible.

- 1. Animals need to be born and raised in Canada.
- 2. The animal must not have been moved to or taken from the farm in the 60 days prior to the projected export date.
- 3. Animals must be genotyped for codons 136 and 171. Females must be genotyped 136AA/171RR; males can be 136AA/171RR or 136AA/171QR.
- 4. Flocks on the Scrapie Flock Certification program that have reached the "Certified" level do not need to be genotyped.
- 5. Animal evaluation and health testing must be carried out by a CFIA-accredited veterinarian.
- 6. Some American states may require additional health tests. Be sure to discuss with your customer and their veterinarian. (e.g. Brucella ovis for South Dakota)
- 7. The letters CAN must be tattooed and clearly legible in the left ear of the animal. Official Quebec identifiers are accepted, but tattoo letters must be added as well.
- 8. To obtain a Canadian export health certificate, you must have a customer import permit.
- 9. The truck or trailer must be washed and disinfected with a chlorinated disinfectant, according to CFIA guidelines.
- 10. You must provide a detailed route that will be used to deliver the animals. This route must be respected during delivery.
- 11. An appointment must be made in advance with the veterinary services at the border post where animals will cross the border. All documents must be provided in advance.
- 12. Depending on the case, if you are going through customs, you may need to hire a third party to handle the regulatory aspects of the transaction.
