Sibling - Four Sisters


Kids - Wadia and Najla

Education


- St. George's School Jerusalem (1940's)
- Victoria College Alexandria (Classmates King Hussein, Elite, Upper Class, Rich families) - 1947-1951
- By 1951 Said was expelled from VC Troublesome despite his academic achievement
- Said sent to Northfield Mount Hermon School,
 Massachusetts USA (Boarding School)
- Said was fluent in English, Arabic and French
- Graduated with A.B in English from Princeton University 1957
- Master of Arts Harvard University 1960
- Doctor of Philosophy Harvard University 1964
- Joined Colombia University 1963 (member of facility of English & Comparative literature)

Definition

<u>Comparative literature</u> is an academic field dealing with the study of <u>literature</u> and <u>cultural expression</u> across <u>linguistic</u>, <u>national</u>, <u>geographic</u>, and <u>disciplinary boundaries</u>. Comparative literature "performs a role similar to that of the study of <u>international relations</u>, but works with languages and artistic traditions, so as to <u>understand cultures 'from the inside'.</u>

Agnostic - "human reason is incapable of providing sufficient rational grounds to justify either the belief that God exists or the belief that God does not exist.









The Question of Palestine ****






