

PARTICIPANT CODE OF CONDUCT

The **Participant Code of Conduct** sets out the standards for participating in our outreach programs. These standards ensure programs are safe for everyone and that we work together to meet community needs. Failure to follow this code of conduct puts participant at risk of losing the right to participate.

- 1. Respect each other's civil rights and religious freedoms.
- 2. Be courteous, fair, and respectful of other participants, customers, volunteers, and staff.
- 3. Avoid excessive noise.
- 4. Violence, threatened violence, or other illegal conduct is not permitted and will be reported to law enforcement authorities.
- 5. Acts that endanger the health and safety of yourself or others or which substantially interfere with the orderly operation of the program will not be tolerated.
- 6. Substance use is not permitted on site.
- 7. Park in designated areas.
- 8. Smoke in designated area.
- 9. Service animals must wear a service vest. All other animals are not permitted on site.
- 10. Sign in and get name tags for you and laundry prior to loading clothes into the machine you are directed to.
- 11. One small load per person present is provided by NSCO. Work can be done if additional are needed or the difference for a larger machine may be paid by participant.
- 12. Participant is responsible for being present to move laundry between washer and dryer and remove from dryer prior to the end of outreach.
- 13. Follow location specific guidelines as explained by volunteers and laundromat staff.

I agree to follow the Participant Code of Conduct. I understand that failure to follow this code of conduct puts me at risk of losing the right to participate. First offense: one week no program. Second offense: one month no program. Third offense: one year of no program. Any violent act against another person is immediate grounds for one year suspension.
