

Sunsetting Social Security and Medicare

In his 12-point plan to Rescue America, Rick Scott proposes to sunset all federal legislation every five years which will require the Senate and Congress to vote to either keep or absolve Social Security, Medicare, CHIP, Medicaid, Veterans Benefits, and the Affordable Care Act.

Medicare Drug Prices

Republicans plan to end Medicare's new ability to negotiate lower drug prices costing seniors more money.

Reproductive Rights

Republican Lindsey Graham has already introduced federal legislation to outlaw most abortions after 15 weeks. Other reproductive rights will also be on the table including contraception, Plan B (the morning after pill), and in vitro fertilization..

Marriage Equality

Justice Thomas, in his majority opinion for Dodd v Jackson, wrote that overturning Marriage Equality should be considered.

Suppressing Voter Rights

Soon the Supreme Court will hear a radical idea called Independent State

Legislature Theory that would give state legislatures wide authority to gerrymander electoral maps, install voter suppression laws, and even political cover to overturn elections. The legislature would have the ability to declare the winner of any election, regardless of how votes were cast.


