Notes for September

The home-stretch...

September is here! The heat of summer may be giving way to football weather and the dogwoods are hinting that fall is approaching. Bonsai trees have made it through the hottest days and are in the home-stretch. What are we doing with our trees now? Here is a list:

- I. Continue feeding if you're using organic fertilizers into the middle of the month; it takes a few weeks to realize the benefits of organic fertilizers and you want trees to be strong for that last growth spurt. Start looking for a low-nitrogen fertilizer with higher Potassium and Potash numbers for use in October-November.
- 2. Watch watering very closely, it gets tricky now. Cooler nights slow evaporation, and hardened-off leaves transpire less. In August, watering was automatic—do it daily. In September, trees

benefit from a slowed wet-dry cycle. Drier weather and increased sunlight will improve fall color.

- 3. Watch the sunlight your trees get. As the sun starts to travel lower in our sky, trees that were once under the shade of overhead trees may suddenly be exposed to very direct rays of hot sunlight.
- 4. Continue to look for pests and fungal diseases. Overnight humidity begins to increase this month, which increases risk of unwanted pests and diseases. Slugs are active and are drawn to organic fertilizers.
- 5. Removing yellowing needles from pine trees. White pines tend to shed old growth before black pines.
 - 6. Start to remove fallen leaves from the soil surface to prevent fungal problems.
 - 7. Check wires and remove those that have begun to be imbedded in the bark.


Buying/Selling Bonsai on Facebook

This month we wanted to highlight a relatively new way where you can buy and sell bonsai related items. This can be done easily and gives access to a vast range of material (trees, pots, stands, etc.) that are not normally available in Middle Tennessee. That is through the various Facebook groups created for Bonsai buying and selling.

All of these are groups you can find on Facebook by searching by their names. They are all private groups so you will have to "Ask to Join". Each group has a set of moderators who can be contacted with any issues buying or selling. Anyone who violates the rules of the group can be banned. Please review the rules of each group before participating in buying/selling process.

If you are nervous to buy material through this method, try watching the sites for a few weeks to learn how it's done and see how many successful transactions are made. It is extremely rare to have a "scam" or even a misrepresentation during a posting and when this occurs the entire group is notified by the moderators.

Below is a list of the groups with a brief summary of how each operates. Some are "auction" groups that allow bids, where the item may or may not have a "Buy It Now" option. Some are straight sales only.



99 Cent Bonsai

99 Cent Bonsai

This is probably the most frequented group. It is specifically for bonsai or bonsai related items with a retail value of less than \$75. It allows auctions only and posts are allowed only during the specified timeframe every week. It opens at 9pm CT on Sundays and closes at 8pm CT on Thursdays.

Bonsai Auctions

Bonsai Auctions

If you are looking for higher quality material, this is the group where it will be. It is for bonsai or bonsai related items that have a retail value of more than \$75. It is not uncommon to see trees or pots being sold for more than \$500. It allows auctions only and posts are allowed only during the specified timeframe every week. It opens at 7pm CT on Tuesdays and closes at 7pm CT Saturdays.

Bonsai Pot Auctions

Bonsai Pot Auctions

This group only allows sales of bonsai related items, no living plants. There are no price restrictions. It allows auctions only and posts are allowed only during the specified timeframe every week. It opens at 11am CT on Mondays and closes at 8:30pm CT on Fridays. This group does not run during the Fall and Winter months and is replaced by the following group.

Bonsai Auctions Fall / Winter

Bonsai Auctions Fall / Winter

This group is a seasonal group specifically for the Fall and Winter months. It allows any bonsai or bonsai related item of any price. It allows auctions only and posts are allowed only during the specified timeframe every week. It opens at 9am CT on Mondays and closes at 9pm CT on Fridays.

Bonsai Sales

Bonsai Sales

This group is for straight sales only for bonsai and bonsai related item of any price. Posts can stay on the site for a month if the item is not sold earlier.

Bonsai Classifieds

Bonsai Classifieds

This group allows straight sales and auctions of bonsai and bonsai related items of any price. Auctions timeframes are specified by each seller and are specific to that item. Items can remain on the site for seven days.
