# Large temperature fluctuations

Avg. Low: 31° Avg. High: 52° Record Low: 13° Record High: 84°

#### Tree Talk

Warmer temps and longer days mean we are seeing the trees begin to take up a bit more water. When temperatures are above 44° the vascular system begins to release the carbohydrates and sugars stored over the winter. This energy release is what causes the buds to swell for our spring growth

#### **How to Respond**

Monitor water needs carefully. Midmonth begins our repotting season. Good time to root and thread grafting if buds are swelling. Protect newly repotted trees from temperatures below 42° and over 75° and high winds. Protect emerging foliage from temperatures below 34°, above 75° and high winds
