July – Care Calendar

Hottest month

Avg. Low 70° Avg. High 89° Record Low 51° Record High 107°

Tree Talk:

Toward the end of July is our hottest time of year. Trees will move into summer dormancy by mid-month. Water uptake will slow and fertilizer will no longer decompose as quickly. Foliage has finished elongating (except ponderosa pines) and should have formed its cuticle. Bugs are very active.


How to Respond:

Stop fertilizing until after the worst of the summer heat passes. Put the scissors down. The trees need their foliage to stay hydrated and cool. 85% of all water uptake is used for air conditioning. This is the "water only" time of year. It is best to water early in the day and then check again to see who dried out. Monitor for Pests and Diseases.
