March Meeting:



Tree Talk

How to Respond

Windiest month Last hard freeze.

Avg. Low 39° Avg. High 61° Record Low 2° Record High 89° Longer days and warmer temperatures mean that most trees are actively putting on new foliage. Water needs continue to increase. New foliage has no cuticle and invites insects and diseases. Best time to re-pot a tree is just before bud break.

Apply 1st round of organic fertilizer for conifers when daytime temps average 60°. Protect trees from high winds by keeping on the ground. Protect new foliage from temps below 42° and over 75° until leaves harden off. Protect newly potted trees from wind and temps below 42°. Monitor water needs. Repot needle juniper, beech and oaks later in month if buds are ready to open.
