On the other hand, with proper technique, we saw our trees put on some substantial late in the year growth and scrambled to remove wire pinching on some trees, while trying to get wiring on to others. Fortunately, we have seen some rain and cooler temperatures in the last half of the month as we prepare our trees for the winter to come.

November – Care Calendar

First hard freeze

Avg. Low 40° Avg. High 59° Record Low 1° Record High 85°

Tree Talk:

We are seeing trees using less water, loss of leaves and the fertilizer is no longer breaking down. Toward the end of the month we will see little, or no, sign of added tissue. The more foliage, trunk and root mass the tree has, the more-cold-hardy the tree is and the more growth potential in the spring

How to Respond:

We need to get trees on the ground and mulched. Complete all winter preparation by Nov. 15th. Give the evergreens their final application of fall fertilizer early in month. Great time to do maintenance work on pines. Protect newly styled trees from 42° and below for 4-6 weeks. As daylight shortens and temps drop, a healthy tree can probably tolerate 22°-26° now.



Branching Out

Here is the final part of Eileen's article on her Bonsai Journey. It has been a joy to read about her Bonsai experience and we hope that this has helped other club members in their own journey!

This is my fourth and final Branching Out article. I will stop after this one, because I am now in my fourth phase of study with my newest teacher, Bjorn Bjorholm. I find this very serendipitous, as Bjorn will be our guest presenter at the November meeting. Believe me, this is a meeting you don't want to miss.

I love the way a bonsai artist's character and personality show up in their trees and in their teaching style. When studying with Mike Hagedorn, I would be seduced by the etherical beauty of the tree he was styling. Each design was subtle and nuanced to pull me into the composition. Just line his teaching. Now, when working on my trees, I will hear Mike's voice encouraging me to think longer term. To allow the tree to respond to the work and tell me what needs to come next. And, then, what needs to come next year, or in 10 years. Mike is also a brilliant author. His first book, Post-Dated: The Schooling of an Irreverent Bonsai Monk (Gold Medal winner 2009 PubWest Book Design Awards)) is a delightful read. His second book Bonsai Heresy has been sent to the publisher and should be available soon.

When studying with Ryan, I was energized and challenged. I needed to bring my best to each day and to each tree. Ryan's energy and creativity are apparent in the trees he styles. Visit www.BonsaiMirai.com and view his Gallery. The trees take my breath away and challenge me to imagine what they will look like in 10-20 years.

I am, now, in my second year of study with Bjorn. He encourages to think 40-80 years out. Because that is how long it takes to grow really fine deciduous trees. Fortunately, we can start with some trunks that already have some age on them, but good branching and ramification take time and consistent attention to styling and care.

Although Bjorn is just as brilliant with evergreens, his passion is deciduous. And while in his classroom the atmosphere flows comfortably between lecture and practicum. I am always amazed how many trees we are able to work each day, without feeling any stress. My learning days are long and rewarding. And, I am tired by the end of the three-day session. But the trees and the teaching feel open and billowy. Is that a word, 'billowy'? Well, it is how I want my deciduous to look, so billowy is now a word for me.
