We had several members show up and participate despite the wet weather.


Shannon put on an excellent presentation and answered many questions regarding Shohin technique. We also had some pot vendors present with many beautiful pots for sale.

October - Tree Talk

First frost Temp. dropping Daylight shortening

Avg. Low 49° Avg. High 71° Record Low 26° Record High 94°

Tree Talk

We are seeing the tree's foliage change color. The trees are really putting on vascular growth now as they begin to store carbohydrates and sugars for winter hardiness and next spring's growth in their entire vascular system. By late October water use begins to slow again.

How to Respond

Give the 2nd application of fall fertilizer. When the maples have reached their peak fall color change, the trees have reabsorbed the chlorophyll, sugars and starches. If we make big branch cuts on our deciduous now, we will see rapid healing. The trees will not move into dormancy for another 4-6 weeks. A healthy bonsai can probably tolerate 26°-32° right now. Check wires weekly. Resume minor foliage maintenance.
