Avg. Low 61° Avg. High 82° Record Low 36° Record High 105°	Temperatures begin to drop and daylight shortens. The trees begin to take up more water. As the trees move from summer dormancy into their fall vascular growth, we will to see wounds healing and branches fattening quickly.	Water needs are increasing so check trees often. Apply 1st round of fall fertilizer when water uptake increases. Check wires weekly as branches add girth. Allow most foliage to grow unchecked. Good time to work juniper.


NBS Members who have previously registered for this course will have received emails detailing our dates and syllabus. We will have a Waiting List sign up at the September meeting.

### Branching Out

Here is part 2 of Eileen Knox's writeup on her Bonsai beginnings. Here she talks about her first Bonsai study group and the importance of sourcing good trees.

As I look back on my bonsai education, I see it in phases based upon my teacher of the time and my gradual commitment to the art. This article looks at phase two of my journey, which is defined by Mike Hagedorn. After joining the Bonsai Society of Portland, I went to all of their mentorship classes. I would attend all of their functions, following the senior members around with a cup of coffee in hand asking all of my questions. And, once most of my trees quit dying, I felt pretty good about taking my next steps.



I was told there was an opening in Mike Hagedorn's monthly study group. I called him and was invited to come over for a garden visit. For those of you who may not know Mike, he is a bonsai artist of the highest caliber. His trees are amazing. His garden is so thoughtfully designed and maintained, you would think you were in Japan. Mike is a student of Shinji Suzuki. The magazines "Bonsai Tonight" and "Bonsai Empire" have some great video on YouTube of their gardens. Mike now trains bonsai professionals himself. I believe he is on his 4<sup>th</sup> or 5<sup>th</sup> apprentice. People come from all over the world to study with him, not only because of his artistry but because he is an exceptional human being. We joke a lot about the fact that I wanted him to marry my daughter. For some reason they were never as keen on it as I was.

Well, after a delightful visit with Mike, I was invited to join his monthly study group. I showed up for my first day with every tree I owned. I didn't know what kind of work we would be doing or what trees I could use. Mike, thankfully, helped me unload my truck. Then he asked me to bring one into the workroom. I, of course, selected a juniper. Since it was August, he suggested we work on creating some jin and shari (create some deadwood). I had no tools, but he generously loaned me his. Unfortunately, I found most of his tools in my tool box the next day. Hummm. Wonder how that happened? I quickly gave him a call and drove over with a box of apology donuts. Being Mike, he laughed, shrugged and asked if I would like a cup of tea with my donut.

During our ongoing conversations, he recommended I graduate from starter trees and \$10 nursery stock. We sat down together with his <u>Kokufu Ten</u> books. Page by page we went through the pictures talking about what I saw and what he saw. And what was desirable in a bonsai and what wasn't. That was probably the most important hour in my bonsai education. From then on, I started looking for INTERESTING TRUNKS. We can usually build the branches and other desirable aspects of a bonsai. It takes lots of time to grow good trunks.

Around this time, BSOP starting having silent auctions at their monthly meetings. Members would bring in trees, pots, tools, scrolls and all sorts of different bonsai stuff. I discovered that I could bid on a tree with a great trunk and sometimes I got it. Mike suggested I visit other bonsai places to find better material. So, a girlfriend and I drove over to Randy Knight's. Randy is one of the premier yamadori collectors in America. I couldn't afford many of his trees, but I did score on a \$40 Juniper Procumbum.

In Nashville we are particularly fortunate to have so many professionals from whom we can buy good trunks and learn how to grown them into great bonsai. I was so encouraged to find these talented individuals when I moved to Nashville. We see, perhaps, 2% of what they have to offer at our meetings. I contacted them asking for garden visits. I was delighted to find so many wonderful new species. Here, in alphabetical order, by first name, (because I couldn't think of a better way) are contact emails.

The bottom line is, once your trees quit dying so often, consider putting a little more into your purchases to get even better trunks. Who says we can't buy time?
