By adapting **international best practices** and leveraging South Africa's existing expertise in satellite accounts, this initiative will transform how sport is understood, governed, funded, and developed.




What is Project Invictus?

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


INTRODUCTION:

WHY A NATIONAL SPORT SATELLITE ACCOUNT?

Sport is woven deeply into the fabric of South African society, fostering unity, pride, and opportunity. Yet, despite its importance, the sector's true economic scale remains invisible in official data. Sport-related activities are spread across multiple industries, making it difficult to isolate and quantify their collective economic contribution using traditional national accounts.

A National Sport Satellite Account (NSSA) is designed to fill this gap. It will isolate and measure all sport-related economic activities, providing clarity and rigour to what has until now been an informal understanding of sport's value. With this foundation, sport can be recognised and managed as a strategic economic and social asset.

CURRENT CONSTRAINTS



An NSSA is the critical first step toward unlocking sport's latent power for inclusive national development.



WHAT IS A SPORT SATELLITE ACCOUNT?

A Sport Satellite Account is a specialized statistical framework that extends South Africa's System of National Accounts to focus exclusively on sport-related economic activities. Drawing on international standards and South Africa's successful Tourism Satellite Account, the NSSA will:



- Define the scope of the sports economy across manufacturing, services, participation, events, and media.
- Compile and analyze sport-specific data from diverse sources including business surveys, household consumption, and trade data.
- Calculate key indicators: GDP contribution, employment, investment, and consumption attributable to sport.
- Estimate economic multipliers to capture indirect and induced effects on the broader economy.

This framework will produce credible, standardized metrics that illuminate sport's full economic and social significance.

Disaggregate data to identify and address disparities across demographics and codes.

Create channels for stakeholders to provide input on NSSA data usability, ensuring it meets evolving sector needs.




