### Robert's Life Story

Rev. Robert Batts, Jr. was born December 3, 1931 to Robert & Lela Mae Batts in Hammond, Texas. He was the 4<sup>th</sup> of eleven children and only one of three remaining until his passing on Saturday, May 13, 2023 at 2:30 a.m.

Robert attended church and school in Robertson county where he met the love of his life, Minyon Drew and together, they began their family bringing eight beautiful children into the world.

In 1953, he enlisted and served two years in the United States Army before being honorably discharged and returning to his wife and two kids in Hammond, Texas in 1955. He then moved his small family to Houston to live. After a little while, he and his wife "Min", as he affectionately called her, settled into their first residence on 28<sup>th</sup> Street, where they met many life-long friends. In 1958, they bought their home in Studewood where they have lived for over 65 years!

Robert was a family man and worked hard to provide for his family and extended family, including many of their relatives who he helped support while they attended and finished high school.

Robert accepted Christ at an early age and as a lad, attended church at Bethlehem Missionary Baptist Church in Hammond, Texas. When he moved to Houston, he united with Providence Missionary Baptist Church, under the leadership of the late Pastor King C. Mason where he served for over 20 years as Sunday School teacher, Superintendent of the Sunday School, Trustee, and where he was ordained first as a deacon and then a minister of the Gospel in 1968.

After many years of service, he moved his membership to Christ Missionary Baptist Church under the leadership of the late pastor, James H. Williams where he served for a short time as associate minister and was also the pastor of Alpha Missionary Baptist Church.

As a generous man, Robert was known to offer visitors to his home everything but the kitchen sink including but not limited to "polly pop", "cho-chos for the kids", "a hot cup of coffee" and "fruit and nuts at Christmas-time". He was well known and loved by the community. He loved to sit outdoors, drink coffee and talk to people walking or driving by. He loved to keep up his cars and property, cutting the grass, trimming the edges and picking up trash. He did this for neighbors too....free of charge and well into his 80's until he just couldn't do it anymore. He then became supervisor, watching and instructing others just how he wanted it to be done.

Robert was quite a character. He loved joking around and having fun with his friends and family. You were guaranteed to be laughing and smiling at the funny things he said. He loved playing dominos with his brothers, sons and others in the community and he especially loved to win!!!

As a young man, he worked for Southern Pacific Railroad and many other odd jobs including but not limited to stocking groceries, and security guard before landing his 38-year career as an oven operator for Cookbook Bakery and eventually, Sunbeam bakery, where he retired in 1992.

#### Dad.


