

A Note from the Director:

An Ideal Husband was first produced in 1895 at the Haymarket Theatre, London, with four Acts and three intermissions. We have managed to pare the play down to the length of a Hollywood action movie. The plots, subplots and parodies devised by Oscar Wilde serve to entertain and oft times amuse the theatre goer. Imagine that you are a member of the English aristocracy, sitting in that first audience, as Wilde's wit and wisdom exposes and extols your vices and virtues. Wilde circulated in that Upper Class, but soon discovered he was not of it and suffered the consequences. As for an ideal husband or any ideal, perception and reality will eventually clash. Watch the dust settle then on the Firehall stage as masks fall away and only universal truths bind the denizens of late Victorian society.

Paul Wintemute (Director)

Paul first appeared at the Firehall Theatre in 1973. Now, fifty years later, *An Ideal Husband* is his directing debut for this company. In the intervening five decades, Paul has been involved in over 60 productions either on stage, directing or producing. Paul was last on the Firehall stage in 2019's *Art*. Other recent acting roles in regional theatre companies include, Fagin in *Oliver!*, Tevye in *Fiddler*, and Applegate in *Damn Yankees*. Not-so-recent favourites include Felix in *The Odd Couple*, Sancho in *La Mancha*, Charlemagne in *Pippin* at Firehall, and both Pilate and Herod in *Superstar*. His directing credits span the plays of Neil Simon, Norm Foster and Marc Camoletti. He extends his thanks to the cast and crew, the builders, painters, the wardrobe team, the designers and producer and finally to his wife Kate, whose support is immensely appreciated.
