As a scheme member you can receive emails directly from the police and other agencies by registering on www.cheshirepolicealert.co.uk



Tick here if you have decided to selfregister with 'Alert' for your messages. Have a chat with your volunteer coordinator if you are unsure. They will still receive messages in addition to the ones you will receive.

You can also leave it to your coordinator to scan incoming messages, and other sources of information, circulating only what is necessary.

Your Neighbourhood Watch Coordinator is already registered in Alert to receive email messages. If you wish to check this registration, check with your local PCSO or email cheshirewatch@cheshire.pnn.police.uk.

To be a member of an active Neighbourhood Watch Scheme all you need to do is pass your contact details to your local Neighbourhood Watch Coordinator. This will enable you to receive crime updates, other community safety advice and warnings.

As your coordinator, I am registered with the Cheshire Neighbourhood Watch Association (CNWA), the Neighbourhood Watch Network (NWN) and Cheshire Police and WILL NOT disclose your contact details to anyone else without your permission. **Schemes** will vary in size, have different local concerns and use different methods of communication. However, all coordinators receive updates and share information with scheme members and Cheshire Police.

Information could include:

- Local crime updates, alerting you to current crime trends or anti-social behaviour
- Crime reduction advice linked to current issues
- Other sources of community safety advice and assistance e.g. contacting your council about dog fouling, fly-tipping, noise nuisance and other anti-social behaviour.

Members are encouraged to take action to reduce the opportunity for crime and antisocial behaviour by:

- Improving home/personal security
- Looking out for neighbours, especially those who may be vulnerable
- Noting down, and reporting, suspicious incidents
- Working with Cheshire Police and other agencies to identify local issues and solve problems where there are community concerns.
