### Did you know?

As printed in the May, 2025 edition of Arkansas Living Magazine, Dogs sneeze to tell other dogs they're friendly, and it's known as a **calming** signal.





The vast majority of the adoptable animals in our care are extremely healthy but infrequently some animals need special temporary treatments or attention. In those cases, we provide assistance for their healthcare needs through our Special Paws program, which ultimately enables the adopted pets to enjoy many healthy and happy years of joy with their families. On rare occasions, though, some animals come into our care when even special treatments aren't enough to make the animal healthy. Such is the case with Simon, a handsome 7-year-old beagle who suffered with seizures. Unfortunately, his foster mom who had adopted Simon had to relocate, and circumstances prevented her from taking Simon with her.

As anyone involved with rescue knows it's difficult to find placement for animals - especially those with medical conditions - it was very hard for the AWL to find just the right home for Simon. Despite three different medications, Simon was still having breakthrough seizures due to epilepsy.

Fortunately, Shelley Shepherd, AWL Dog Adoption Coordinator, contacted the wonderful folks at The Henry Haven, a Senior Rescue and Sanctuary in Arkansas.

Henry Haven provides a safe haven for senior/medical needs animals so they can live the remainder of their lives receiving the medical care and love they deserve. They have experience managing epilepsy, and their hope is that they can come up with a treatment plan to better manage Simon's seizures.

### Volunteers step in overdrive to save lives

It's been a long hot summer, especially for our volunteers who continue to tirelessly take care of the animals that fill the Adoption Shelter and particularly our foster homes where our "kitten explosion" is still in full force. Currently, there are nearly 100 animals - cats, kittens, and dogs - at the shelter or in foster homes. Many are adoptable now, including over 25 kittens, and others will be ready as soon as they have been spayed or neutered. Our volunteers have indeed been working in overdrive (2 shifts per day) to ensure the animals are fed, their health monitored, medications given, dishes, cages and litter pans cleaned, laundry washed, supplies ordered, and time provided for socialization among other vital tasks. We hope this is never needed, but our friends from the Bissell Pet Foundation wisely recommend pet owners prepare a disaster kit with items for your pet's basic survival needs in case of a crisis or emergency. FEMA recommends having two kits, one larger kit if you are sheltering in place and one lightweight version if you need to evacuate. For more information, visit Bissell's website below. Also, if you don't already have one of our free emergency decals for your front door or window, next time you visit the Adoption Shelter please pick up one to alert any emergency responders that may come to your home.

#### Bissell Pet Foundation

Make a plan. Arrange a safe place where you can take your pets before disasters or emergencies happen.

Use the buddy system. Plan with friends, neighbors or family to evacuate pets if you are unable to do so.

Microchip your pet. Make sure your address and phone number are up to date.




