# Rescue Report

## **Special Election to Add Board Position**

Our Bylaws state that initially the Board of Directors consists of nine members to include the five officers plus four At-Large members. Since our Board is a true "working" Board with all members serving AWL in unpaid positions (putting in about 30–to 40-hour workweeks), the Bylaws provide for some flexibility. If the Board thinks AWL needs an additional Board position, the Board can propose a candidate and the position to the members in a special election.

At the May Board meeting, the BOD approved an additional seat, so now the members will vote. We are providing proxy forms since we know some may not be able to attend the meeting. That form is attached.

WHEN: Wednesday, June 27 at 10:00 a.m.

WHERE: Room 3, Village Church of Christ, 210 Balboa Road

Vote to add At-Large Place 10 to focus on fundraising with Beverly Fitzpatrick as the initial director in that position.

Number of Ballots:

In order to be eligible to vote, a person must be a member in good standing at the time of the election. If you have an individual membership, you will receive one ballot; family membership will receive two ballots. If not a current member, you can complete the membership application and pay the fee and you will receive ballot(s) at the time.

Students highlighted how keeping litter out of their environments, how respecting wild animals' need to be left alone, and how having plants that nourish wild and farm animals help them thrive.


All winners received a certificate for framing and cash for designated amounts. The first place winner was Jes-




**Kieschnick of Jessieville** who will enjoy a meal with a \$25.00 gift certificate.
