How Can You HUG Our Pets? Here's How

As mentioned, we now transport numerous dogs and puppies to other states for successful adoptions. Before transporting, we must see that they are healthy, vetted with shots, sterilized if old enough, and clean. Clean is the word.

We need a team to give baths to dogs prior to transport.
