Special Membership Meeting

The Board of Directors will present proposed shelter building renovations to the members in a special meeting. Come to Room 4 of the Village Church of Christ at 10:00 a.m., Wednesday, May 22 for an update.

Many of you know we have been investigating improvements to the building to ensure greater sanitation for the pets as well as for all of us who volunteer and for the POA Animal Control Officers. Nothing has been decided yet, but we are considering various renovations.

Our Bylaws state that before the BOD votes on major expenditures, we present the ideas to the membership for input, though members do not vote.

AWL has had some generous donations that are specifically designated for our building fund, and we are planning to work with the POA to make any final upgrades. The Board is looking forward to improving the conditions in the building, and we believe all of the pets, volunteers, and visitors will benefit from AWL's investment.

Please be aware that plans are just plans and subject to revision, but the BOD hopes this update will be an outline for renovation. Join us on May 22 for a preview!

5 More Things You Didn't Know About Cats & Dogs

- 11. Cats can make over 100 sounds. From meowing and yowling to chirping and caterwauling, each sound communicates something different.

Why Register My Dog with the POA?

All dogs physically housed or boarded for more than 30 days in Hot Springs Village are required to be registered with the HSVPOA. The registration fees go to the Animal Control budget which funds the shelter for the POA responsibilities, such as Animal Control Officers' pay, utilities, etc. These funds do not lessen the funding that AWL provides, such as all veterinary care, food, and litter. AWL continues to finance those parts of what is POA responsibility in accordance with our agreement to use part of the building for adoptions and housing.

Champions

AWL's program for a sustaining pledge is the "Champions." These committed folks contribute a small \$10 a month as sustaining members. Each month we have a 50/50 raffle, with a cap payout of \$500. **Champions proceeds to date are \$29,860.00**.
