Nickols, Angela our Spay/ Neuter organizer and chair, offered these happy statistics: Because of the COVID 19 virus, we had to cancel two of our spay/neuter clinics this year. However, the local vets that participate in our s/n program have sterilized **309** cats and dogs from March through July for a grand total of 6,664.

Can Dogs & Cats Eat Pumpkin? A Seasonal Question

As a matter of fact, pumpkin is a superfood for both dogs and cats — which means there are a ton of benefits! From this article:

Digestive health: It can help with constipation problems, help ease an upset stomach, or keep your dog or cat regular.

Urinary health: Both pumpkin flesh and seeds may benefit urinary health in cats and dogs. Seeds can be ground up and put on top of pet's regular food.

Weight Loss: You can sub out a portion of their regular food with equal parts of pureed pumpkin.

What to feed? Raw or pureed pumpkin and pumpkin seeds are beneficial. But, for canned pureed pumpkin, make sure you're getting pure pumpkin rather than the "pumpkin pie" version, which are full of sugars and other additives.


he's probably adaptable to nearly any household with pets. He will be a big boy

Why Register My Dog with the POA?

All dogs physically housed or boarded for more than 30 days in Hot Springs Village are required to be registered with the HSVPOA. The registration fees go to the Animal Control budget which funds the shelter for the POA responsibilities, such as Animal Control Officers' pay, utilities, etc. These funds do not lessen the funding that AWL provides, such as all veterinary care, food, and litter. AWL continues to finance those parts of what is POA responsibility in accordance with our agreement to use part of the building for adoptions and housing.

Champions

AWL's program for a sustaining pledge is the "Champions." These committed folks contribute a small \$10 a month as sustaining members. Each month we have a 50/50 raffle, with a cap payout of \$500. **Champions AWL proceeds to date are \$38,565.00.**
